DISCUSSION	<p>Joel - Is this within the CDAC/WCC Purvey</p> <p>Mike Grimm - Alternate Chair of CDAC for Door County. The purpose behind the resolution is that there is a seat for each of the stakeholders. Been talking with landowners and there doesn't seem to be a voice for the landscapes and other elements, etc., and felt a resolution may help identify if this is a concern for citizens.</p> <p>Rob - The concerns would fall under the Urban seat based on the description.</p> <p>Mike is concerned about the wild landscape and not the urban/metropolitan environment. It is a different system than natural heritage of WI. Areas of the state where the state designates state natural areas. Looking for the voice of the wild landscapes and made a distinction in his mind about this.</p> <p>Rob - feels the concerns are covered under Agriculture and Forestry and feels these are covered in these other areas.</p> <p>Mike - the forestry representative is close if the forestry representative would speak to under-story vegetation. Looking at tree regeneration. The other areas feels it misses these other areas.</p> <p>Scott - Isn't anything not covered by the other seats covered by the Chair and Alternate Chair.</p> <p>Mike - Agrees that yes these two positions should cover it and should take up the issue.</p> <p>Scott - Between Ag, Forestry and the WCC seats it would be covered rather than changing the law.</p> <p>Mike - agrees that if it can be included and additional guidance given to the CDACs to pay attention to impact on the natural areas. The DNR biologists do speak to the issue to some degree. The resolution was an attempt to institutionalize it.</p> <p>Jeff Pritzl - This could be covered by the Wildlife Biologist and should be bringing to the table the interests and needs to the CDACs. However the presentation is based on the deer metrics and it doesn't capture this issue. This is not unique to Door County and CDACs from Price and Vilas counties have raised up the issue. Hears from both sides - CDACS are too hunter focused and not balanced and others share that the deer hunters are not balanced. This is about what is the proper balance on the CDACs. This is about the next 3 year cycle and Jeff could offer both critiques and benefits of the other seats. Encourages this CDAC committee to review current state and process and schedule another meeting for later this year/early 2023. Deer rule changes don't go through</p>	

	<p>the legislative process individually and usually go through as a package. Would be interesting to see public input via Spring Hearings.</p> <p>Motion to Table: Rob has a meeting with two BOD members and others to discuss CDACs, etc in the upcoming weeks to discuss what is working, what needs to change, etc. and why he moved to table. Joel shared that for years now, we have been pushing for a browse metrics and would include herbaceous growth. Feel like adding another seat will not be effective. Feels we would not find people to fill a seat like this. Would be better off to ensure that we have the information included in the CDAC discussions through the other seats like Ag, Forestry, Wildlife Biologist. Terri agrees with Joel and feels that by bringing this to light through the DNR presentations, biologist, forester, etc that we can address the issue and concern. Jeff - will work over the template that the biologists share and have a discussion about this issue. Mike - is willing to help Jeff.</p>
