Wisconsin students interested in the outdoors are invited to join the Youth Conservation Congress (YCC). This statewide youth program is designed to grow and develop future conservation leaders across the state. The YCC is a student extension of the Wisconsin Conservation Congress (WCC).

The purpose of the YCC program is to give young people a voice and instill a sense of ownership, civic pride and advocacy for Wisconsin's natural resources. The YCC strives to effectively engage, educate, and involve youth in the management and protection of our natural resources and foster a conservation ethic through participation in the program.

The YCC program offers opportunities for students from all backgrounds, including seasoned outdoor enthusiasts and novices alike. Although the program is best suited for high school students, younger individuals are welcome to apply.

YCC student delegates are exposed to various aspects of natural resource management and have access to learn from professionals in those fields. Students also receive real-world experience through service-learning and job shadowing opportunities.

By joining, members gain an understanding of the process for how Wisconsin's natural resource policy is determined, including the role and history of the WCC - the state's statutorily recognized citizen advisory body.

Participants will strengthen valuable skills such as problemsolving, effective communication, teamwork, and leadership competencies through working with other YCC delegates, WCC delegates and DNR staff while building an appreciation for the many facets of resource management.

The YCC program mirrors the WCC's focus on county level initiatives. WCC delegates serve as mentors and as a point of local contact for the YCC delegates.







Statewide Opportunities:

- January: Ice fishing weekend (2025 will be on the Castle Rock Flowage). All YCC delegates are invited to learn new fishing techniques from mentors and peers, review safety on the ice, learn about local aquatic ecosystems, and enjoy fishing with friends.
- March: Explore UW-Stevens Point. The YCC
 Oversight Committee meets yearly at UWSP and YCC
 delegates learn about the College of Natural
 Resources through a behind-the-scenes tour.
- May: Annual Conservation Congress Convention
 (2025 will be in Oshkosh). YCC delegates learn about the business of the WCC, participate in field trips, listen to speakers talk about local conservation initiatives, meet new YCC delegates, compete in trivia, and much more.
- June: YCC career day (2025 will be in Madison). YCC delegates explore natural resource related professions, discover jobs within the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, and explore educational institutions with natural resource degrees.
- August: YCC summer program (2025 will be held along the Mississippi River). This is a 4 day
 program for YCC delegates to learn about local natural resource management, explore
 conservation careers, help with service work, develop leadership skills and spend time recreating
 outdoors. We partner with county, state and federal natural resource managers to explore local
 conservation efforts around landscape, wildlife, water, and human dimensions of conservation.
- August: Youth Zone at the Waterfowl Expo (Oshkosh). YCC delegates lead learning stations and help with hands-on activities for families and youth of all ages.
- October: Fall YCC hunt for upland birds or waterfowl (location to be determined). Novice and experienced hunters are welcome. Equipment and instruction will be provided.

Local Opportunities:

- Connect with WCC delegates and participate in county meetings, local initiatives, mentored hunting activities, and learn more about the Conservation Congress.
- Volunteer with local natural resource professionals to learn about careers and assist with management objectives and research tasks (duck banding, goose banding, pheasant stocking, fish surveys, fish stocking, wildlife surveys, job shadowing and more)



- Volunteer with local conservation groups to assist with service projects, fundraisers, and educational events.
- Connect with local mentors to participate in hunting, fishing and trapping experiences.
- Participate in leadership opportunities to promote the YCC through civic organizations, local clubs, school classes, and youth groups.
- Gain academic credits by participating in YCC activities and initiatives. The YCC provides a variety
 of experiential learning opportunities that could be applied towards academic credit for a high
 school student looking to complete an independent learning project.
