- 8. Snowmobile trails shall not be routed over bodies of water. If stream crossings make bridging necessary, bridges should be at least 8 feet wide. If the bridge is located on an abandoned railroad grade, the bridge shall be a minimum of 10 feet wide free from obstruction.

Trail 68 has been used for many years with the first request for trail funding submitted in 2009. This heavily used trail is located in two townships: 11 and 12N; and Sections 26, 28, and 30. This East/West trail 68 connects two funded North/South trails, Corridor 11 and County Trail 31. Both trails, Corridor 11 and County Trail 31, connect Columbia County to Dane County. If funded, trail 68 will provide a riding and grooming loop vs grooming up 15 miles North and West of Columbus to intersect with County Trail 31 and then groom 15 miles back down to Dane County. If funding is approved, this will be a shorter option to the Ciy of Columbus for a gas stop.
