Call to Order	Members Present: Chair, Roger Walsh, Jan Allman, Bruce Neeb, and Korin Doering Others Present: Bobbi Winebar, Sara deBruijn, Jessica Terrien, Cheryl Housley, Gina Keenan, Chris Halbur, Mary Rothenmaier, Annie Loechler, Faith Murray, Cathy Burrow, applicants and members of the public.	Meeting called at 9:42 AM by Roger Walsh.
	2. Acceptance of Minutes of Previous Meeting	Minutes of April 12, 2022	Motion by Jan Allman, seconded by Bruce Neeb to approve the minutes of April 12, 2022. No discussion. Motion carried unanimously.
	3. Department Reports	Fund Condition (see attached budget)	 Bobbi Winebar presented the budget indicating that we have a total appropriation of \$3,400,000 plus \$324,957 of SEG carryover for a total balance of \$3,724,957 for SFY2023. No enumerations from legislature. Total funding commitments thus far: \$14,389. Total funds available this meeting: \$3,710,568.12 which consists of \$1,515,284.06 from the Inland Lakes pot, \$1,515,284.06 from the Great Lakes pot and \$680,000 from the Discretionary pot. Bobbi Winebar proposed leaving the Discretionary as a separate pot and not dividing it in half between the Inland Lakes pot and the Great Lakes pot. That way they could use it as needed and not have to wait until April 1 to use more than half of it. Use bonded first.

	that are no wake and electric motor only. The policy established was to hold these projects until the 4 th quarter.	policy from the policy document for the following reasons: 1. Commissioners that put this policy in place in 2015 are no longer on the
		commission. These commissioners didn't feel that these small lakes added any value for recreational boating.
		2. Statute 30.635 Motorboat prohibition. On lakes 50 acres or less having public access, motorboats may not be operated in excess of slow-nowake speed, except when such lakes serve as thoroughfares between 2 or more navigable lakes. The department
		by rule may modify or waive the requirements of this section as to particular lakes, if it finds that public safety is not impaired by such modification or waiver. 3. This is the only statute or administrative
		code that has any restrictions for the use of recreational boats on lakes 50 acres or less, so why should we make those projects wait until the last quarterly meeting if they meet the parameters of 30.635.
		Bruce Neeb made a motion to remove this policy from the policy document. Jan Allman seconded. Roger Walsh stated that a full motion wasn't needed, that they could just remove it from the policy document.

INLAND & GREAT LAKES

- Eau Claire County, Lake Eau Claire Launch Redevelopment: Presentation included background on lake system and all three project applications (#1, #8, & #9) on the agenda. See #8 below for full discussion notes. Project deferred to future meeting. (see finding of feasibility section).
- 2. Winnebago County, Grundman Boat Landing Renovation & Improvements: They have another funding source (NRDA) that will assist in constructing more parking stalls and adding a turnaround which will make this launch safer. They also plan to add an ADA bathroom, transient dock, canoe/kayak launch, and security lighting. Project will need to go to JFC. Roger Walsh asked about type of canoe/kayak launch. It is an EZ dock. Jan Allman asked about number of ADA stalls. Their total meets ADA requirements. Korin Doering asked about launch fees. They are kept in a separate budget for launch operation and maintenance.
- 3. Waupaca County, Big Falls Accessible Canoe/Kayak Launch & Dock:
 They will be installing a EZ Dock ADA compliant canoe/kayak launch. They stated that another EZ Dock launch that they purchased 15 years ago is still in use and still in good shape. The Big Falls dock will be taken out in winter. This is a very popular spot to launch and paddle to the rapids areas. Bruce Neeb

	asked about whether trailered boats use the launch. A few do but not very often. Mainly paddlers. Korin Doering asked about installing safety signs for new users so they know about the rapids area. They will install signage. Bruce Neeb asked about ADA parking. They will have one ADA parking spot by launch and a total of 7 other parking spaces (some will be across road).
	Burnett County Forestry & Parks, Devils Lake Public Access - COST AMENDMENT: Need to Install sheet metal retaining wall to maintain parking area. Congested area, only public access on the lake. Costs increased because they are being required to add rip rap below ordinary high water mark to protect base of sheet pile. Annie Loechler made comment that there is a messy erosion problem and safety issue that really needs fixing. Project will now have to go to JFC if the requested funding is approved. Bruce Need asked about the parking number being less than the minimum number for the lake size and asked if there are any town road access sites. They will follow up on the answers for this.
	Waukesha County, Nagawicka Lake Launch & Parking Renovations: They will reconstruct and improve the parking lot at the boat launch, concrete pad, concrete ADA path to bathrooms and boardwalk to differentiate between vehicles and pedestrians. There will be 7 ADA parking spots total. Bruce Neeb asked about a stormwater plan. They will provide grants staff with the plan to

There is a lower lot by the launch and a lot up the hill for overflow.
 City of Omro, Lower Miller Boat Launch COST AMENDMENT: Project has been completed and included the complete renovation of the Lower Miller Park Boat Launch. Costs increased due to material shortages and vendor issues due to the pandemic. Project will need to go back to JFC for approval.
7. Town of Wheaton, Boat Launch Improvements: They plan to reconstruct the boat ramp, add ADA parking, add a boarding dock and take out trees that make launching difficult. Launch is very popular but unsafe. Their plans include erosion control on the hillside and upper parking lot so runoff doesn't flow into the river. Improvements will make navigating while launching easier. Worked with PE to design. Roger Walsh asked about launch fee. The town board doesn't war to charge a fee. Bruce Neeb stated that he appreciated the design features on their launch and pier.
8. Eau Claire County, Lake Eau Claire Ski Row Dredging: presented but deferred to future meeting (see finding of feasibility section): Roger Walsh indicated sediment trap eligibility needs policy discussion and change. Korin Doering asked about the ecological value with dredging? After dredge, there is better substrate habitat

for spawning and rearing. Bruce Neeb
said in a 2013 Lake Protection grant
contract that sand traps need to be
maintained by Lake Eau Claire
Association. Bruce Neeb wants legal
opinion on contract conditions to see if
there is a 10 year limit. Korin Doering
asked about watershed study and
wanted more info on amount of sand
being dredged. There is a study
underway which is being modeled from
previous years. Korin Doering asked for
ecological and economic impact on
system as part of the study. Jan Allman
asked to clarify ADA parking and cost of
dredging. There will be 6 parking spots
that will be striped after dredging project
is complete and resurfacing happens.
Korin Doering asked about how current
the cost estimate on the launch is.
About 1 year old. County will cover cost
overruns.
9. Eau Claire County, Lake Eau Claire
Sediment Traps: presented but deferred
to future meeting (see finding of
feasibility section).

10. Arkdale Lake District, Arkdale Lake Boat
Launch Dredging: presented but
deferred to future meeting (see finding
of feasibility section).
Launch is located in the Central Sands
area and is filling in. Plan to do a 40'
wide dredge instead of 50' because of
the small lake and space. The banks are
too narrow. Depth and longevity based
on experience. In 2002, a large sand
deposit from a storm required dredging
which lasted 20 years. Parking at lake
access is a wide flat area without any

	designated parking or facilities to launch a boat. The area is very rural and owned by the town not the lake district. Bruce Neeb requested follow up with contour map of lakebed and proposed dredge since they are not using an engineer. Jan Allman stated that they should have an ADA sign installed to designate the ADA parking space.
Finding of Feasibility	Bruce Neeb made a motion to fund all projects, except for 3 Eau Claire County projects and Arkdale's dredging project. Korin Doering seconded motion.
	Discussion Roger Walsh stated that the Eau Claire sediment traps do not follow our dredging policy and since the sponsor needs to do the dredging before they can renovate the boat launch, there will need to be a policy meeting before we can make a decision on these projects. Bruce Neeb requested an opinion from legal as to whether the surface water grant contract time period is relevant and another legal opinion if DNR can fund sediment traps. Bruce Neeb stated that they should have PE designs for pathways at the boat launch.
	Bruce Neeb stated that the Arkdale project needs work on ADA and dredge design plans. These should be signed off by an engineer and cost figures should be updated. Korin Doering would like estimate of rate of sedimentation and how long the dredge will last. Jan Allman stated that they
	should provide information on ADA improvements and specific dredging widths and slopes for longevity. Motion carried unanimously.

	Jan Allman made a motion to approve a grant for: Burnett County Forestry & Parks, Devils Lake Public Access - COST AMENDMENT for 50% of total project costs, not to exceed \$232,937, Bruce Neeb seconded. No discussion. Motion carried unanimously.
	Bruce Neeb made a motion to approve a grant for: Waukesha County, Nagawicka Lake Launch & Parking Renovations for 50% of total project costs, not to exceed \$196,280.42, Korin Doering seconded. No discussion. Motion carried unanimously.
