

Report Summary NBI Ratings: 9-7 Good, 6-5 Fair, 4-3 Poor, 2-1 Critical, 0-Closed #6 Deck Superstructure #6 #4 Substructure #8 Channel Overall Condition Poor Recommendations/Maintenance Items: ****Keep the deck and superstructure and plan to replace the pier as soon as it can be planned and funded. This bridge should be inspected every 24 months or less. The bent should have diagonal bracing on it. Fill the approaches in. Replace West bridge ahead sign.

6) Example of Intersection to Intersection Measurement

If this bridge is closed due to unsafe conditions, how far around would riders need to travel?

In the example below, to bypass the bridge in question, riders would need to travel 5.73 miles on a trail to the NW.
