Public Comments	A representative from Sawyer County Snowmobile Alliance would like to groom with a heavy-duty truck w/tracks. He asked the Council to classify (set a rate) for this. Gary looked at it and said he didn't think what they had previously determined would work so they need to discuss further. He spoke about the time they spent in MN at the manufacturer checking out the tracks.	It was stated that pickup trucks with tracks had previously been placed in the Class B category. However, it may be that depending on size, etc., they may fit in multiple classes. Council stated tracked trucks would be discussed further in the Equipment Rates section of the agenda.
	A representative from Chippewa County asked about the groomer rates and if they were finalized. They have a TS100 Sur Trac and the way the rates are now it's a Class B which he thought would make it too expensive to use. They also have a Sur Trac 110 that is almost identical. They pull the same drag, do the same job, take about the same money to operate. His committee would like the Infrastructure Committee to think about adding another tier in the grooming class.	Again, it was stated that this topic would be discussed further during the equipment rates section of the agenda.

	They would like the TS100 grand-fathered in as well. At least they'd have some time to try to make other arrangements.

Will they allow requests to come in at any time or do they Counties need to hold those and adhere to the April 15 deadline? Requests of \$23,271.50 from Vilas County and \$25,220 from Monroe County.	The Council will entertain storm damage requests at regularly scheduled meetings. They will keep open the option of scheduling unanticipated meetings if circumstances warrant. Note: DNR committed to create a draft process for consideration at the Feb. committee meeting. It was suggested that it may be possible to incorporate that into the application as an appendix.

	Blue Mounds State Park: We are waiting for a decision on the lawsuit challenging the trail through the park. We expect that to happen before the first of November.	
	 Great Sauk Trail-Wisconsin River Bridge: Wisconsin and Southern Railroad (WSOR), Wisconsin River Rail Transit Commission (WRRTC) and WisDOT have a plan set to address the 2 sections and 3 piers that are claimed to be damaged and unsafe. Once that happens, the push for the trail and bridge into Dane County will start. 	
	Sauk Prairie Rec. Area (SPRA): There is still a lingering concern with area snowmobilers on the last-minute decision to remove the first snowmobile trail alternative of being included on the main route. Snowmobilers are fine with the alternative, but will expect that a complete and connected snowmobile trail is a part of the SPRA.	
	Amery to Dresser-Stower 7 Lakes- We are working hard to get Polk County officials to update their plan and communication with the DNR to implement snowmobile use.
