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BIL LSL Funding Overview

FFY 2024 cap grant \$83,278,000Reallotted FFY 2022 funds \$4,148,000

- 49% of LSL cap grants must be awarded as principal forgiveness (PF) to disadvantaged municipalities or projects in disadv. census tracts
- Remainder of LSL cap grant must be used for set-asides and loans
- PF cannot be awarded if the loan/set-aside funds are not utilized


LSL Program Basics

- Applications for SFY 2025 funding due July 1, 2024
- For SFY 2026 funding Intent to Apply due October 31, 2024
- Applications for LSL replacement and/or inventory projects submitted separately from watermain projects, even if related
- Any municipality can apply, but PF can only be awarded to disadvantaged municipalities or for projects in disadvantaged census tracts
- Galvanized lines that are, or have been, downstream of lead, brass service lines, & lead goosenecks all considered LSLs
- All property types eligible possible tax implications for non-residential properties



Project Scoring

- Projects will be scored three ways:
 - LSL specific scoring for ranking projects to allocate PF & loan funds from LSL cap grant (see pgs. 21-23 of draft SDWLP IUP or form 8700-383)
 - Modified disadvantaged scoring to determine eligible PF % for private side construction & filter costs (see pg. 23 of draft SDWLP IUP)
 - Regular SDWLP disadvantaged criteria scoring to determine eligible PF % for remaining costs (see pgs. 15-17 of draft SDWLP IUP)



- Weighting of data for projects in multiple disadvantaged census tracts may be done by census tract population or by number of LSLs
 to be replaced (if by number of LSLs, locations & number of LSLs must be known at time of application)
- Census **tract** is smallest unit that can be scored (block groups can be used in some circumstances)

LSL-Specific Scoring

Scores based on:

- Project Type: replacement 150 pts &/or inventory 10 pts
- Family Poverty Percentage: pts = to poverty %
- Lowest Quintile Income: 0 to 20 pts
- Percent of Population Under Age 5: 10 to 30 pts
- Mandatory Replacement Ordinance: 0 or 10 pts
- Lead Sampling Results or Large System Optimization: 0 to 50 pts
- Whether all remaining LSLs will be removed by project: 0 or 20 pts
- Matching Grants for Residential Replacements: 0 to 15 pts
- Municipal Population (tie-breaker only)
- LSL PERF form 8700-383 submit with application

- Due to BIL requiring exactly 49% of LSL cap grants to be awarded as PF, an exact % cannot be determined until all applications are received.

Allocation of Funds

- LSL PF for private side replacements allocated first, in order of LSLspecific priority score (construction & filter costs only)
- If any LSL PF remains after previous step, allocation will move to remaining costs, in order of LSL-specific priority score
- After all PF allocated, LSL loan funds will be allocated in LSL priority score order
 - ► Loan funds from the LSL cap grant 0.25% interest rate
 - Any loan funding beyond the LSL cap grant at regular SDWLP rates
- After deducting set-asides, ratio of PF\$ to Loan\$ is approximately 59 to 41



Loan Funding on the Private Side

- Loan funding at 0.25% will cover all project costs not covered by PF
- All LSL loans secured by Taxable Bond; this means:
 - No reimbursement resolution required
 - 18-month rule for reimbursements does not apply
 - Disbursement at loan closing is not required



- If covering private side costs with a Water Revenue Pledge (ratepayer funds), prior PSC approval required & must comply with 2017 Wisconsin Act 137 (§ 196.372, Wis. Stats)
 - No more than 50% of cost may be covered by a grant provided by <u>utility funds</u>
 - Loans provided by utility funds cannot be forgiven
 - All customers in a class must be treated the same
 - Mandatory replacement ordinance required
- PF is not from ratepayer funds so providing PF for more than 50% of the costs or that is targeted to a disadvantaged census tract should not violate Act 137. PSC says issue might need to go to the Commission for a final decision.

Loan Funding (cont'd)

General Obligation Note Pledge

Normally 10-year terms but can be up to 20 if requested
 No mandatory replacement ordinance is required

Alternative Revenue Pledge

- S. 66.0627(8)(ag), Wis. Stats. is legal basis (also part of 2017 Wisc. Act 137)
 Requires two ordinances:
 - Creation of property owner loan program
 - Mandatory replacement
- Repayments from property owner loans pledged as security for SDWLP LSL loan
- Loans to property owners can be for up to 10 years with interest up to 4%
 Term of SDWLP loan can be up to 12 years (with 0.25% interest rate)



Federal Requirements

All projects must:



- Pass environmental review screening for all locations
- Solicit for disadvantaged businesses at all levels of contracting or when advertising RFQs
- Erect BIL Signage
- Comply with **Davis-Bacon** & Related Acts
 - Required for all municipal contracts Heavy Wage Determination applies
 - If using a prequalified list, only required for business-owned properties
- Comply with Build America, Buy America (**BABA**) procurement requirements **BABA Guidance in the draft IUP is incorrect.**
 - Projects funded by Financial Assistance Agreements under \$250,000 are exempt under Small Projects Waiver
- Comply with any applicable Federal Equivalency requirements
 - Complete list of equivalency requirements available on our website

Contracting Options for LSL Replacements

• Municipally-bid contract


- Familiar process for most municipalities
- Best way to get a large number of replacements done quickly
- Davis-Bacon always applies Heavy wage determination should be used, even if just replacing private side LSLs

Prequalified List

- Municipality issues Request for Qualifications (RFQ) to establish the list. Needs to include certification that all federal requirements will be followed. (BABA & Davis-Bacon when it applies.)
- DBE solicitation applies to advertising the RFQ
- Good option for smaller municipalities with fewer LSLs or for spot replacements
- Davis-Bacon only applies to properties owned in the name of a business

Targeted Census Tract Projects

- One way to score projects is using Census Tracts instead of a municipality's data from the Data Sources webpage
- This can adjust the score in several ways, but it requires more input to determine a project area
- Tracts could be most useful when a municipality wants to focus LSL replacements on the most disadvantaged areas




Census Tracts: Overview

- The Census has many levels of data including Tracts
 - Tracts are small, relatively permanent subdivisions of a county
 - Population ranges between 1,200 and 8,000, but the ideal size is around 4,000
 - Census tracts contain both Blocks and Block groups
- We use Tracts because the majority of data for PF scoring is found at the Tract level at the lowest
 - MHI is found at the block group level but requires you to know how many LSLs will be replaced in each block group. <u>Using block group MHI may take a</u> **substantial** amount of work, please be wary of using it.



Finding your Data

- First, make sure you have at least one tract selected. It helps to just use one to get used to the Census at the start.
- Next, in the search field, enter the tables you want to use
 - MHI: B19013
 - LQI: B19080
 - Family Poverty %: S1702
 - Households: S1101 (only used to calculate a population weight)
- Move over to the Tables tab to review your data!







Calculating a Score: Single Tract

- The census data you find will help you calculate a score
 - Calculation descriptions are available in the SDW IUPs
 - Other data, such as Unemployment, can be found on our <u>Data Sources page</u>
- Remember that this score is just an estimate, and the program will make a final determination on PF score



Calculating a Score: Multiple Tracts

- Using multiple tracts is possible, but it requires more work to calculate a score
- You must calculate a population-based weight, either based on the number of LSLs replaced in each tract, or based on population in each tract
 - This is so each tract is given adequate weight in the score.
- Once you have a population weight, you weigh the data and sum it to get a weighted score.



Example: Manitowoc, WI

- Manitowoc is like many municipalities where some tracts are disadvantaged while others are not.
- Using ACS 2022 5-year data, tract 5 and tract 8 are excellent examples
 - Both of these tracts are disadvantaged and can alter the score







Each municipality that plans to apply for financial assistance from Environmental Loans must submit an <u>Intent to Apply</u> (<u>ITA</u>) with Priority Evaluation and Ranking Formula (PERF) information and a Financial Assistance Application through the online systems. 



- Inventory Technical Assistance DNR has a contract with Jacobs Engineering to provide inventory technical assistance to water systems.
 - Utilizing \$12,952,200 starting in SFY24 & an additional \$8,742,600 added in SFY25

LSLR Community Outreach Grant Program

- The upcoming Lead Service Line Replacement (LSLR) Community Outreach Grant Program will provide eligible municipal community (MC) public water systems with the funds to conduct outreach in support of lead service line replacements.
 - MC systems with a planned or ongoing LSLR project will be eligible to apply. More eligibility details will be available when the grant launches.
- Funded by BIL set-asides
 - SFY 2024: \$4,060,150 for the first cycle
 - SFY 2025: \$4,371,300 for future cycle(s)

LSLR Community Outreach Grant Program

- Community outreach is crucial to the success of lead service line replacement.
 - Grant recipients can partner with community-based organizations (CBO) if they want to communicate to their customers through a trusted local messenger. A partnership with a CBO is not a requirement to apply.
- Applications for the first cycle will open **summer 2024, date TBA**. Applications will be accepted through **April 30, 2025**, or until funds are exhausted, whichever comes first.
