DNR Seeking Public Comment For Environmental Review Of Village Of Junction City Safe Drinking Water Loan Program Project

MADISON, Wis. – The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) today announced it is seeking public comment on the Safe Drinking Water Loan Program's environmental review determination of the Village of Junction City project.

The project includes installing a section of watermain on East 3rd Street between Case Avenue and Chapley Avenue to improve its public drinking water system. The project also includes recoating the interior and exterior of the water tower.

Activities related to this project are minor actions under chapter NR 150, Wis. Adm. Code, for which no environmental analysis is required; an environmental review must be conducted under 40 CFR 35.3580 before funding this project.

The Village of Junction City submitted with its financial assistance application the information and materials required to conduct a National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)-like environmental review of the potential environmental impacts of the project and related activities.

The Safe Drinking Water Loan Program has determined that the project will not result in significant adverse environmental effects, and no further environmental review or analysis is needed before proceeding with funding the project.

The public is encouraged to submit comments regarding this decision and the potential environmental impacts of this project. Submit comments by Oct. 27, 2025, to:

Based on the comments received, the Safe Drinking Water Loan Program may prepare an environmental analysis before proceeding with the funding process. The analysis would summarize the DNR's consideration of the project's impacts and reasonable alternatives.
