- Reform of the New Source Review (NSR) Permitting Program is a current EPA priority
- TSMC Arizona Begin Actual Construction EPA Response Letter
 (September 2, 2025) outlines the EPA's current plans for clarifying the regulatory meaning of "Begin Actual Construction"
 - Reaffirms the regulatory interpretation provided in a March 2020 draft guidance memorandum on Begin Actual Construction
 - In 2026, the EPA intends to propose and finalize revisions to the federal NSR regulations, including revisions to the definition of "Begin Actual Construction"





Potosi Air Monitoring Shelter Replacement: Before





Ozone Serious Bump Up Litigation

- February 14, 2025 Wisconsin filed suit in the Seventh Circuit Court of Appeals challenging the EPA's reclassification (bump-up) of Wisconsin's nonattainment areas to Serious nonattainment.
- August 15, 2025 Wisconsin filed a motion to stay the bump-up rule pending outcome of litigation.
- September 5, 2025- Seventh Circuit granted Wisconsin's motion to stay the bump up rule in Wisconsin.
- While the stay is in effect, the Moderate nonattainment area requirements will remain in place.

Serious Stay- Permitting Impacts

Construction permits

- Moderate nonattainment area criteria will be used to determine nonattainment area new source review (NNSR) applicability and requirements
- If a source took a Serious NNSR avoidance limit, the source may apply for a minor construction permit to request relaxing the avoidance limit to the Moderate area threshold.

Operation permits

- So long as the stay is in place, sources are not required to submit an operation permit application to comply with Serious requirements.
- A source that applied for a new or revised operation permit solely to address the Serious major source thresholds may elect to withdraw the application.
- Registration Operation Permits (ROPs)
 - A source that applied for coverage under a different type of ROP solely to address the changed ROP eligibility criteria due to the Serious major source thresholds may elect to reapply for coverage under their previous ROP.

Petition to reconsider Wisconsin's revised nonattainment areas

- June 2021 The EPA revises and expands Wisconsin's 2015 ozone NAAQS nonattainment areas.
- August 2021 DNR files request that the EPA reconsider these revised designations. Request is acknowledged by EPA.
- June 2025 DNR submits letter to EPA Administrator requesting prompt action on the June 2021 petition.
