Dear Ms. Good:

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has reviewed the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources' (WDNR) 2021 Annual Air Monitoring Network Plan (ANP) and approves the plan and proposed changes to WDNR's network of air quality monitors described in Table 14 of your plan.

EPA evaluated the plan and appendices, as well as information about monitoring sites submitted to the Air Quality System database. EPA confirmed that WDNR's plan documents its commitment to maintain and operate its air quality surveillance system, includes evidence that each monitor meets the requirements of appendices A, B, C, D, and E of 40 CFR Part 58, and was available for public comment for at least 30 days prior to submittal to EPA.

EPA acknowledges and approves the following specific modifications in WDNR's ANP and recognizes that some of these changes will be implemented before December 31, 2021.

- Relocation of the SO₂, NO₂, and O₃ monitors from the Milwaukee SER DNR Headquarters site, which will be demolished, to a new Milwaukee UWM Park & Ride site.
- Relocation of the seasonal NO_y monitor from Milwaukee SER DNR Headquarters to the Chiwaukee site.

If you determine that changes to WDNR's monitoring network are needed due to unplanned circumstances or revisions to the federal ambient monitoring and quality assurance requirements, the modifications must be reviewed and approved by EPA.

Finally, thank you for taking part in the 2020 Five-Year Network Assessment workgroup. When evaluating changes to your network in future years, please refer to the assessment for potential opportunities to improve the network.
