Issues Addressed: Vapor intrusion pathway is significant health risk and there are insufficient funds to address all vapor sites.

- The vapor intrusion pathway poses health risks
- No mechanisms exist to provide financial assistance at properties where vapor intrusion is suspected or confirmed
- DERF isn't solvent and cannot provide any financial relief
- Previous attempts to provide funding did not move forward (Revitalize Wisconsin 2023 Assembly Bill 1055)
- Semantics
- Processes



Proposed Solution: Establishment of Vapor Contamination, Mitigation, and Stewardship Cleanup Fund.

- Stand-alone fund to finance vapor contaminated properties for the protection of human health
- Nature and number of funding mechanisms is unlimited
- Application and use of the Fund is unrestricted because vapors have been identified as a significant health concern





Significant Changes: Second time around is really the charm...

- Fund Administration: WDNR sole administrator
- Site Eligibility
 - Unrestricted
 - Financial vetting process
 - Cost recovery for viable RP
- Applicability
 - Private landowner/tenant
 - LGU/agency
- Semantics: Key definitions
- Process: How funds will be dispersed

This issue paper is to document the business need for mitigation contractor certification in Wisconsin and related issues for consideration. Discussions have been led by an ad hoc committee consisting of volunteers from the DNR's Remediation and Redevelopment External Advisory Group's (RR EAG) Vapor Intrusion Subgroup. A mitigation certification program is being considered to address issues with contractor qualifications and accountability identified in Wisconsin with both radon and vapor intrusion mitigation systems. The National Radon Proficiency Program (NRPP), which is administered by the Indoor Environments Association (IEA), also known as AARST, is working to develop and finalize credentials for vapor intrusion mitigation on a national level. The goal of mitigation contractor certification is to ensure soil gas mitigation systems, designed and installed by qualified personnel according to established industry consensus standards, are protective of the health of occupant and limit potential characteristics.


