

# **2022 VISITOR GUIDELINES**

**SUMMER VISITOR HOURS: 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Wednesday through Saturday**, and Summer holidays, Memorial Day, July 4, and Labor Day. The Education Center is closed Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday, EXCEPT open summer holidays or by special appointment. Please call two weeks ahead to schedule group tours for up to 20 people.

**LOCATION**: <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mile north of the Village of Wild Rose on the west side of Hwy 22, (between Co. Rd. P to the North, and Co. Rd. A to the South.) Tours begin in the Education Center (N5871, west side of Hwy 22). Follow the driveway up hill to the parking area. *Please park boats, canoes, and trailers at the first lower lot by the large visitor sign.* (NOTE: Most GPS units do not find our location.)

# **GROUP LEADER'S GUIDE FOR HATCHERY TOURS**

PLEASE DO NOT COME TO THE HATCHERY IF YOU ARE FEELING SICK OR HAVE BEEN EXPOSED TO COVID-19. MASKS ARE RECOMMENDED IF YOU HAVE NOT BEEN VACCINATED.

#### TOUR INCLUDES:

- 1. HATCHERY PRODUCTION: A 10-minute video of hatchery facilities showing what we do at the hatchery (spawn fish, hatch, raise and stock in Wisconsin waters).
- 2. TOUR OF NEW COLDWATER HATCHERY: <u>Guided by DNR staff only</u>. DNR hatchery staff will guide visitors to a viewing room to look inside hatchery. We have the capacity to raise over 200,000 fingerlings in 40 circular tanks and incubate 5.2 million salmon and 7.2 million trout eggs.
- 3. EXPLORE MUSEUM EXHIBITS AND DISPLAYS: including two 300-gallon aquariums in Education Center, simulated fish exploratory lab, fish identification, aquatic invasive species, and the Lake Michigan story.
- 4. VIEW BROWN TROUT IN HISTORIC PONDS: You will see the oldest and biggest brown trout in our historic raceways. You may feed fish with food in our feed dispenser located under the picnic shelter. (Note: If you wish to feed them, please bring quarters as the machine only takes quarters). *PLEASE DO NOT THROW STONES, DEBRIS OR HUMAN FOOD IN PONDS AND RACEWAYS.* We feed fish a special diet of fish pellets. <u>PLEASE DO NOT FEED FISH ANY HUMAN FOOD</u>. The feed is composed of ground up fish, and other nutrients, so hands will smell fishy. Plan to bring hand wipes or hand sanitizer. Do not rub eyes or put fingers in mouth after feeding fish. Wash hands before and after handling fish feed.

To allow adequate social distancing among group pods, the conference room and visitor viewing room in the new Coldwater hatchery can accommodate up to 20 people. Due to hatchery bio-security practices and to avoid risk of contamination, visitors do not go inside hatchery work areas. Tours are held "rain or shine" as we can do most activities indoors, except viewing the oldest "retired" brown trout in the historic ponds outside. Plan to bring weather appropriate clothing. **GROUPS SHOULD TAKE CARE OF RESTROOM NEEDS BEFORE ARRIVING FOR THEIR TOUR SINCE WE ONLY HAVE ONE RESTROOM.**
