VISITOR INFORMATION

SPRING & FALL VISITOR HOURS: 8 A.M. to 3 P.M. Thursday-Saturday. April, May, Sept & Oct. SUMMER VISITOR HOURS: 8 A.M. to 3 P.M. Wednesday through Sunday, Memorial Day through Labor Day. The Education Center is Closed Mondays and Tuesdays, EXCEPT open summer holidays. Please call 2 weeks ahead to schedule group tours of 10-30 and allow minimum 1-1/2 hours to 2 hours for the hatchery tour and activities. LOCATION: $\frac{1}{4}$ mile north of the Village of Wild Rose on West side of Hwy 22, between Co. Rd. P to the North, and Co. Rd. A, to the South. Tours begin in Education Center (N5871, West side Hwy 22). Follow drive up hill.

LEADER'S GUIDE TO HATCHERY EDUCATIONAL GROUP TOUR & ACTIVITIES

- 1) HATCHERY INTRODUCTORY POWER POINT & FIELD WORK VIDEO photos of the old and new hatchery facilities showing what we do at the hatchery (spawn fish, hatch, raise and stock them in Wisconsin waters).
- 2) EXPLORE HANDS-ON EXHIBITS and two 300-gallon aquariums in Education Center, including simulated fish exploratory lab, fish identification, aquatic invasive species and aquatic habitat requirements.
- 3) TOUR OF NEW COLDWATER HATCHERY <u>guided by WDNR Staff</u>. (Take van/school bus 1/4 mile North to new Coldwater Hatchery with WDNR Guide.) Hatchery Guide takes visitors to viewing room to look inside hatchery. Capacity: raise over 200,000 fingerlings in 40 circular tanks; incubate 5.2 million salmon and 7.2 million trout eggs.
- 4) VIEWING BROWN TROUT IN HISTORIC PONDS You will see the oldest and biggest Wild Rose Brown Trout in our historic raceways. You may feed fish with our feeding dispenser located on the picnic shelter. PLEASE DO NOT FEED FISH ANY HUMAN FOOD. PLEASE DO NOT THROW STONES IN RACEWAYS AT FISH.
 - 5) INTERACTIVE, EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES: (Group Leaders may choose one activity)
- a) FISH MIGRATION game reinforces concept of trout and salmon moving from Lake Michigan to streams to spawn.
- b) HABITATS and requirements of aquatic ecosystem,
- c) FISH MIGRATION STORY (for PreK-4th grade)
- d) EGG STAGES of Development samples and Wild Rose story of "Eggs in and Fish out."
- e) FOOD WEB game to learn the importance of balanced ecosystems, and the significant role that Wild Rose Hatchery has in Wisconsin's 3-billion dollar sport fishing/tourism industry.
- f) FISH CASTING game "Match your Catch" to identify Wisconsin fish to get them excited about fishing in Wisconsin.
- g) Testing water quality/chemistry, if supplies available. (Usually jr. high or students in water studies i.e. DO, pH.)


The conference room and visitor viewing room in the new Coldwater Hatchery accommodate up to 30 people. Due to bio-security practices and chance of contamination, visitors do not go inside Hatchery work facilities. Tours are held "rain or shine" as we can do most activities indoors, except viewing oldest "retired" brown trout in historic ponds outside. Plan to bring weather appropriate clothing. Please take care of restroom needs before arriving for tour since we only have one restroom.

If you would like your group to feed brown trout in historic ponds, bring 25 cents for the fish feed dispenser (the machine takes quarters only). The feed is composed of ground up fish, and other nutrients, so your hands will smell fishy. Plan to bring hand wipes or hand sanitizer. Do not rub eyes or put fingers in mouth after feeding fish. Wash hands after handling fish feed. Note: We do not allow anyone to feed bread or other human food to fish.

FISHING IS NOT ALLOWED ON HATCHERY PROPERTY.
