

# Introduction

Lake Six is a 142-acre seepage lake with stained water and a maximum depth of 15 feet. In 2022, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) conducted an early spring electrofishing survey to assess the northern pike population.



### **NORTHERN PIKE**





During the targeted, early spring electrofishing survey, crews sampled a total of 28 northern pike at a moderate rate of 15.6 per mile. Northern pike ranged in length from 19.8 - 26.3 inches and averaged 22.8 inches. These results suggest that northern pike are present at moderate densities, and the population exhibits a quality size structure.

#### **PUMPKINSEED**



During the non-targeted, early spring electrofishing survey, crews sampled a total of 15 pumpkinseeds at a low rate of 12.5 per mile. Pumpkinseeds ranged in length from 3.2 - 6.2 inches and averaged 4.5 inches.







During the targeted, early spring electrofishing survey, crews sampled a total of 128 yellow perch at a high rate of 106.7 per mile. Yellow perch ranged in length from 2.9 - 8.4 inches and averaged 4.8 inches. These results suggest that yellow perch are present at high densities, but most individuals in the population are relatively small.
