
Introduction

Long Lake is a 370-acre drainage lake with stained water and a maximum depth of 34 feet. In 2022, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) conducted a late spring fyke-netting survey to complete a muskellunge population estimate.

MUSKELLUNGE



During the targeted, late spring fykenetting survey, crews sampled a total of 52 muskellunge at a high rate of 1.9 per net-night. Muskellunge ranged in length from 24.8 - 41.5 inches and averaged 33.2 inches. The muskellunge density in Long Lake was estimated at 0.5 adults per acre, suggesting that muskellunge are present in high densities, but most individuals are relatively small.



OTHER SPECIES

Throughout the netting survey, crews also sampled northern pike, walleyes, yellow perch, bluegills, common shiners, rock bass, pumpkinseeds, greater redhorses, white suckers, yellow bullheads and golden shiners.
