LAKE: Two Mile COUNTY: Douglas YEAR: 2025

Introduction


A late spring electrofishing survey was conducted on Two Mile Lake (WBIC 2503500) in Douglas County on May 29th, 2025. Gamefish were collected along the entire shoreline (1.8 miles) and all species were collected along 1 mile of shoreline. Although these surveys primarily target bass and bluegills, other species observed included smallmouth bass, yellow perch, black crappie, yellow bullhead, white sucker and bluntnose minnow. Comparisons were made to previous surveys and similar Wisconsin lakes in the same lake class.


BLUEGILL



There were 181 bluegills captured and length ranged from 1.4 to 9.3 inches. Bluegill catch rate (blue dots) was near the average for similar Wisconsin lakes (dashed line). Since the 2013 survey, the bluegill catch rate increased dramatically but size structure decreased slightly. Fifteen 6–7-inch bluegills were kept for aging. Age ranged from 4 to 6 years with a mean of 5.0 years, which is slightly faster than average growth for Douglas and Bayfield counties.





LARGEMOUTH BASS



There were 48 largemouth bass captured and length ranged from 5.8 to 20.0 inches. Largemouth bass catch rate (blue dots) was near the average for similar Wisconsin lakes (dashed line). Since the 2013 survey, the largemouth bass catch rate more than doubled, with more quality size fish but fewer preferred size fish.

OTHER SPECIES

There were 63 yellow perch captured but all were less than 6 inches. Two smallmouth bass were captured and were 6.7 and 18.3 inches. One 10.3-inch black crappie was captured. Other species captured included bluntnose minnow, yellow bullhead and white sucker. Three northern pike were observed but not captured.

Summary

Overall, the fisheries in Two Mile Lake are improving. The largemouth bass and bluegill populations both increased substantially in abundance, and size structure remained similar. Prey fish were abundant, particularly small yellow perch and bluegill, and should support the growing largemouth bass population. Although infrequent, smallmouth bass, northern pike and black crappie were present.
