#### Introduction

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources requires tournament organizers to hold a permit for fishing tournaments which contain more than 20 boats, more than 100 people, are held with a catch-hold-release format, are held on a trout stream, have more than \$10,000 in prizes awarded, or any tournament for bass that allows culling. # **Applications**

632 Applications were received
29 applications were withdrawn
26 applications were cancelled
0 applications were denied
577 applications were approved and held
386 catch-hold-release tournaments (67%)
148 catch and keep tournaments (25.5%)
101 immediate release tournaments (17.5%)

## **Notable Results**

12 fewer tournaments were held in 2017 than in 2016: a decrease of 2.04% from 2016 to 2017.

Prize value awarded decreased by \$179,417 from 2016 to 2017.

Number of largemouth and smallmouth bass registered increased by 4,444 and walleye increased by 4,324 from 2016 to 2017.

Figure 1: Permitted Fishing Tournaments by County in 2017




Figure 2: Species summary for fishing tournaments from 2009 – 2017


