Introduction

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources requires tournament organizers to hold a permit for fishing tournaments which contain more than 20 boats, more than 100 people, are held with a catch-hold-release format, are held on a trout stream, have more than \$10,000 in prizes awarded, or any tournament for bass that allows culling. Applications

633 Applications were received
18 applications were withdrawn
22 applications were cancelled
0 applications were denied
593 applications were approved and held
358 catch-hold-release tournaments (60%)
157 catch and keep tournaments (26.5%)
118 immediate release tournaments (20%)


Notable Results

16 more tournaments were held in 2018 than in 2017; an increase of 2.7% from 2017 to 2018.

Prize value awarded increased by \$405,059 from 2017 to 2018.

Number of largemouth and smallmouth bass registered decreased by 7,109 and walleye increased by 9,682 from 2017 to 2018.

Figure 1: Permitted Fishing Tournaments by County in 2018






Figure 2: Species summary for fishing tournaments from 2009 – 2018


