Introduction

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources requires tournament organizers to hold a permit for fishing tournaments which contain more than 20 boats, more than 100 people, are held with a catch-hold-release format, are held on a trout stream, have more than \$10,000 in prizes awarded, or any tournament for bass that allows culling. Applications

667 Applications were received
23 applications were withdrawn
20 applications were cancelled
0 applications were denied
624 applications were approved and held
397 catch-hold-release tournaments (64%)
149 catch and keep tournaments (24%)
121 immediate release tournaments (19%)

Notable Results

31 more tournaments were held in 2019 than in 2018; an increase of 5.3% from 2018 to 2019.

Prize value awarded increased by \$997,743 from 2018 to 2019.

Number of largemouth and smallmouth bass registered increased by 12,417 and walleye increased by 7,258 from 2018 to 2019.




Figure 2: Species summary for fishing tournaments from 2009 – 2019


