2025 VISITOR GUIDELINES

Visitor Hours are April through October from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Spring & Fall School Group Tours: available upon request with minimum 3 weeks' notice. SUMMER VISITOR HOURS: Wednesday through Sunday and summer holidays; Memorial Day, July 4, and Labor Day. The Education Center is closed Monday, and Tuesday, EXCEPT open summer holidays. Please call at least three weeks ahead to schedule group tours for up to 30 people. There is no fee for group tours.

LOCATION: ¼ mile north of the Village of Wild Rose on the west side of Hwy 22, (between Co. Rd. P to the North, and Co. Rd. A to the South.) *NOTE*: Some GPS units do not find our address. Tours begin in the Education Center (N5871, west side of Hwy 22). Follow the driveway past large Visitor sign to park next to the building. Park boats, canoes, and trailers at the lower lot by the large visitor sign.

GROUP LEADER'S GUIDE FOR HATCHERY TOURS

PLEASE DO NOT COME TO THE HATCHERY IF YOU ARE FEELING SICK OR HAVE BEEN EXPOSED TO COVID-19. TOUR INCLUDES:

- 1. HATCHERY PRODUCTION: A 10-minute video of hatchery facilities showing what we do at the hatchery (spawn fish, hatch, raise, and stock in Wisconsin waters).
- 2. TOUR OF NEW COLDWATER HATCHERY: <u>Guided by DNR staff only</u>. DNR hatchery staff will guide visitors to a viewing room to look inside hatchery. We have the capacity to raise over 200,000 fingerlings in 40 circular tanks and incubate 5.2 million salmon eggs and 7.2 million trout eggs.
- 3. EXPLORE MUSEUM EXHIBITS AND DISPLAYS: including two 300-gallon aquariums in Education Center, simulated fish exploratory lab, fish identification, record wall of 26 Wisconsin fish species, aquatic invasive species, lake sturgeon exhibit, mock fishing pond and Lake Michigan story.

To allow adequate social distancing among groups, the conference room and visitor viewing room in the Coldwater hatchery can accommodate up to 30 people.

Due to hatchery bio-security practices and to avoid risk of contamination, visitors do not go inside certain hatchery work areas. Plan to bring weather appropriate clothing. Tours are held "rain or shine" as we can do most activities indoors. The old hatchery historic ponds are outside and self-guided. You may see fingerling and some yearling brown trout. **PLEASE DO NOT THROW STONES, DEBRIS OR HUMAN FOOD IN PONDS**.

THERE IS ONLY ONE RESTROOM FOR MEN and ONE FOR WOMEN. GROUPS SHOULD TAKE CARE OF RESTROOM NEEDS BEFORE ARRIVING FOR THEIR TOUR.
