Robert's Rules of Order

- Steps in handling motions:

 - o The Chair will state the motion for the floor "I open the motion (state motion) for discussion."
 - o The Council will discuss the motion if needed.
 - o The Chair will ask for a vote on the motion "I put the motion (state motion) to vote." All in favor of the motion, please say "aye." All opposed of the motion, please say "nay."
 - o A 2/3 majority is needed to pass a motion.
 - o Chair announces the results of the motion.
