Waters of State


"Waters of the state" as defined in ch. 283, Stats., means those portions of Lake Michigan and Lake Superior within the boundaries of Wisconsin, all lakes, bays, rivers, streams, springs, ponds, wells, impounding reservoirs, marshes, water courses, drainage systems and other surface or groundwater, natural or artificial, public or private within the state or under its jurisdiction, except those waters which are entirely confined and retained completely upon the property of a person.



- Issued to a specific category or class of discharges
- All facilities covered under one permit

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

The responses you choose are completely anonymous. No personally identifiable information is collected.




Other activities covered under WPDES Low Impact GP

- Maple Syrup Derived Wastewaters
- Wash water from outside washing activities (vehicles, equipment, other)
- Noncontact cooling waters, boiler blowdown, other condensates (if discharged to groundwater only)
- Public swimming pool and water attraction wastewater (if discharged to groundwater only)
- Air conditioning/Compressor condensates
- Other Low Impact Discharge Activities on case-by-case basis

May be required to submit discharge screening data when applying for coverage



Limited Applications in ORW/ERW	Not Allowed in ORW/ERW

Requirements of the Low Impact GP

Surface Water Discharge Screening Levels:

- pH: Range between 6.0 to 9.0 s.u.
- TSS: 8.0 mg/L
- BOD: 6.0 mg/L
- Chlorine: 0.019 mg/L
- Oil & Grease: 3.0 mg/L
- Temperature: 120 °F
- DO: specific to waterway
- Chloride: 79 mg/L
- TP: specific to waterway
- Ammonia: specific to waterway
- Additives review for Toxicity


Similar requirements for Groundwater and Wetlands

Note: Discharge screening is waived for alum applications

What is reviewed during Low Impact GP approvals

- Objectionable Deposits
- Floating or submerged materials
- Unsightliness
- Toxic substances Additives review process
- Discharge rate
- Erosion control
- Visible oil sheen or film
- Visible solids or foam
