### Description

#### Municipal solid waste

Ashes and sludges from electric and process steam generating facilities

Pulp or papermill sludges produced by waste treatment or mfg processes

Manufacturing solid waste from foundries

Sludges produced by municipal wastewater treatment plants

All other solid wastes not designated as hazardous waste

Hazardous wastes

Hazardous ashes or sludges from electric or process steam generating facilities

Hazardous sludges produced by waste treatment or mfg process

Hazardous manufacturing process solid waste

Hazardous sludges produced by wastewater treatment facilities

Hazardous tailing solids

Nonhazardous tailing solids or nonacid producing taconite solids

Hazardous sludge

Nonhazardous sludge

Hazardous waste rock

Nonhazardous waste rock or nonacid producing taconite waste rock

Any prospecting or mining waste not specified in categories 12 - 17

Waste exempt from fees-used as daily cover, berms, dikes, etc.

Ash from incineration for energy recovery

High volume waste exempt from fees-used for daily cover, berms, dikes, etc

Shredder fluff exempt from fees -used as daily cover, berms, dikes, etc

Contaminated soil exempt from fees used as daily cover, berms, dikes, etc

Waste exempt from recycling fee-intended as recycled fiber unusable for paper making

Construction & demolition (C&D) waste - subject to all the same fees as cat 1 waste

Sediments contaminated with PCBs that meet criteria in s.289.645(4)(d) & s.289.6

Waste generated by a non-profit org that meets criteria in s.289.645(4)(b), WI statutes

Storm debris meet criteria-s289.63(6)(b), 289.64(4)(b), 289.645(4)(f), 289.67(1)(fm)

Waste removed at request of DNR to mitigate potential environmental impacts

MRF residues

C&D MRF residues

Waste re-disposed in a licensed LF where fees had already been levied

Soils / dredged sediments not mixed with other wastes not included in other categories
