PUBLIC NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF A NUTRIENT MANAGEMENT PLAN AND INTENT TO REISSUE A WISCONSIN POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (WPDES) PERMIT No. WI-0053376-07-0

Permittee: Maple Leaf Farms Downy Duck Farm, 24830 Washington Ave, Kansasville, WI, 53139

Facility Where Discharge Occurs: Maple Leaf Farms Downy Duck Farm, 24830 Washington Ave Kansasville

Receiving Water And Location: Unnamed tributaries to the Wind Lake Drainage Canal Watershed and groundwaters of the state

Brief Facility Description : Maple Leaf Farms Downy Duck Farm is an existing Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation (CAFO) for Pekin ducks in the Town of Dover in Racine County, Wisconsin. Maple Leaf Farms Downy Duck Farm consists of barns, solid stacking pad, and six liquid waste storage facilities, four of which are planned to be abandoned during the permit term. The current duck flock is 965.7 animal units (29,000 ducks). There is no planned expansion (structures or flock size) during the permit term.

Approximately 1,335,000 gallons of liquid manure and process wastewater, and 6,000 tons of solid manure is produced annually at the current flock size. All liquid waste generated on farm will be transferred to a wastewater treatment plant for disposal. No liquid waste is planned to be land applied. Maple Leaf Farms Downy Duck Farm owns or rents 1,891.7 acres of cropland, of which approximately 1,681.7 acres are spreadable.

The Department has tentatively decided that the above specified WPDES permit should be reissued.

Persons wishing to comment on or object to the proposed permit action, the terms of the nutrient management plan, or the application, or to request a public informational hearing may write to the Department of Natural Resources at the permit drafter's address. All comments or suggestions received no later than 30 days after the publication date of this public notice will be considered along with other information on file in making a final decision regarding the permit. Anyone providing comments in response to this public notice will receive a notification of the Department's final decision when the permit is re-issued. Where designated as a reviewable surface water discharge permit, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is allowed up to 90 days to submit comments or objections regarding this permit determination. If no comments are received on the proposed permit from anyone, including U.S. EPA, the permit will be re-issued as proposed.

The Department may schedule a public informational hearing if within 30 days of the public date of this notice, a request for a hearing is filed by any person. The Department shall schedule a public informational hearing if a petition requesting a hearing is received from USEPA or from 5 or more persons or if the Department determines there is significant public interest. Requests for a public informational hearing shall state the following: the name and address of the person(s) requesting the hearing; the interest in the proposed permit of the person(s) requesting the hearing; the reasons for the request; and the issues proposed to be considered at the hearing.

Information on file for this permit action, including the draft permit and fact sheet (if required), the operation's nutrient management plan and application may be inspected and copied at the permit drafter's office, Monday through Friday (except holidays), between 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Please call the permit drafter for directions to their office location, if necessary. Reasonable costs (15 cents per page for copies and 7 cents per page for scanning) will be charged for information in the file other than the public notice and fact sheet.
