A timber harvest will be taking place at Pike Lake between Kettle Moraine Rd. and Powder Hill Rd. from approximately mid-December 2024 through March 2025. All trails in the timber harvest area (including the observation tower) will be closed to use during active harvest operations.

All ski trails east of Powder Hill Rd., the multi-use trails west of Kettle Moraine Rd. and the snowmobile trail route will remain open.

During the timber harvest, the Ice Age National Scenic Trail will be rerouted on the bike trail to make a continuous route through the property.
