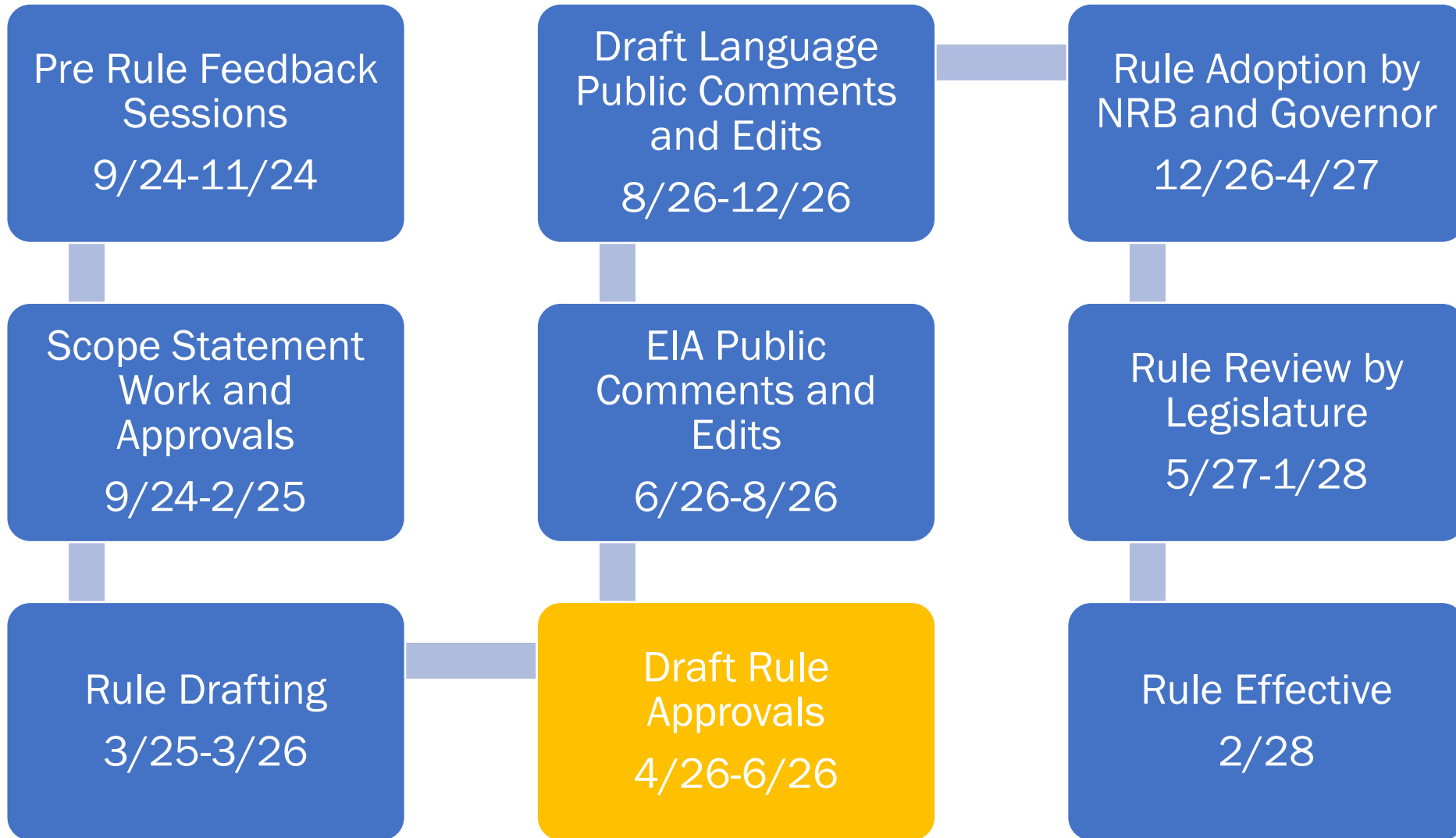

# Why?

- Majority of rules last updates in 2006
- Updates to accommodate changing waste streams, changing technologies and increased proposals to reuse and recycle
- Improved clarity and standardization of requirements
- Improved alignment between code and real life situations
- Fee updates to cover cost

# Overlap with traditional recyclables

- RU and MRF code unchanged & transfer exemption still stands
- Generator responsibility
- Other separated waste streams (batteries, tires, mattresses, shingles, demolition waste, wood waste, demolition waste, yard waste) will see storage and transfer changes
- Transporter exemption and fee changes
- General licensing changes

# Generator responsibility

- Generators of nonresidential waste that contract with licensed transporters must provide
  - “sufficient information about the waste for the transporter to be able to determine a delivery location”or
  - an “acceptable delivery location”

# Storage and Transfer

- Requires transfer facilities to maintain marketable condition
- Nonputrescible waste stored up to 1 year
- Better defines what materials can be stored uncontainerized
- License exemptions now all found under transfer code
- Allows for outdoor transfer of nonputrescible or fully containerized wastes

# Transporters

- Removes exemption for transporters only landfill banned recyclables only from nonresidential sources
- Narrows exemption from anyone under 20 tons per year to businesses hauling <20 tons per year whose primary business isn't collecting and transporting waste
- Requires those using the exemption to demonstrate <20 tons upon request
- Changes annual base license fee from \$110→\$275
- Raises additional trucks from \$33→\$50

# General licensing

- Adds clear procedures for all facility types carrying out the Statutory authority, to suspend or revoke licenses if a solid waste facility has
  - not paid required fees
  - or
  - has grievously and continuously failed to comply with an approved plan of operation code requirements
- Adds the authority to transfer a license and plan approval for any type of solid waste facility (including landfills) due to an ownership change.

# Financial responsibility

- Includes new MRF OFR process in general OFR language

# Other high-level changes

- Low hazard exemptions codified
- Adds exemption and condition authority
- Adds licensing exemptions for yard waste collection, scrap metal transfer, fill transfer and transport, municipal storm debris collections sites
- Removes NR 502.08(2)(i) product exemption
- Creates process for mobile operations
- Improves open burning allowance specificity and consistency
- Adds carcass composting code
- Requires (free) license for on farm composting taking offsite SSCM
- Provides an IW sharp grinding alternative
