# How to Host a Snap-a-thon

# What is a Snap-a-thon?

Snapshot Wisconsin Snap-a-thons are friendly competitions where a group of people tag animal photos on our crowdsourcing website, <u>Zooniverse</u>, to gather as many points as possible.

## Who can participate?

Anyone familiar with Wisconsin wildlife and with operating a computer can participate. No need to be a wildlife expert: Zooniverse has a built-in field guide to help with more difficult classifications.

# 1. PICK A LOCATION:

Choose a place where computers and a reasonably fast internet speed are accessible. Classrooms, libraries, and community centers work well.

#### 2. GATHER SUPPLIES:

Gather writing utensils, including differently colored pens/markers for making verifications, and a timer. Use the Checklist on the back of this handout. Optional: field guides for tricky I.Ds, prizes.

# 3. ADVERTISE:

Get the word out about your event! Post on social media, post flyers (with permission), or partner with a local organization.

# 4. <u>CLASSIFY:</u>

Begin your Snap-a-thon and start classifying on <u>SnapshotWisconsin.org</u>! Identify species on the Species Checklist to rack up points! Make sure to have somebody verifying the 3- and 5point species.

# 5. <u>CELEBRATE:</u>

Once your determined time period is up, tally up scores and distribute prizes or bragging rights.
