Rule Information

The proposed rule seeks to address issues in three areas related to the state's electronics recycling law and E-Cycle Wisconsin program. First, changes to s. 287.17, Wis. Stats., enacted in March 2024 from 2023 Wisconsin Act 108, require rulemaking for full implementation. Second, the department has identified problems with electronics collectors inaccurately reporting information about collection sites they do not directly operate. Third, improper disposal of rechargeable batteries and battery-containing devices has caused hundreds of fires in Wisconsin garbage and recycling trucks and facilities.

To address these issues, the proposed rule would do the following:

- Consistent with requirements established under 2023 Wisconsin Act 108, codify procedures for calculating and assigning electronics manufacturers' annual recycling targets. This includes addressing requirements for manufacturers that register in the middle of a program year and changes to manufacturer-reported sales data used to calculate targets.
- As directed by 2023 Wisconsin Act 108, establish criteria for what will constitute "good faith progress" toward meeting a manufacturer's recycling target, and for how a manufacturer can demonstrate good faith progress.
- Clarify registration and reporting requirements for electronics collectors.
- To reduce the fire risk posed by devices powered by rechargeable batteries during garbage and recycling collection and processing, consider whether additional types of these devices should be included as eligible electronic devices under E-Cycle Wisconsin.
