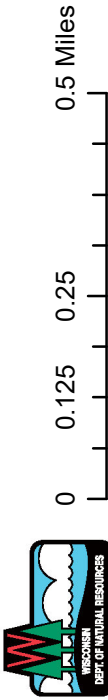

Harvest Requirements

Marked Thinning w/Gaps: (C.471 S.32) 10 acres.

- Harvest all trees marked with **Blue Paint**.
- **Canopy Gaps:** Bounded with Purple Paint. Harvest all trees greater than 1" except for Oaks, Pines, Hemlock, Yellow Birch, and Cedar. Do not harvest Purple Painted trees.

Clear Cut Areas: (C.19 S.7, C.471 S.16, S.31, S.36) 70 acres.

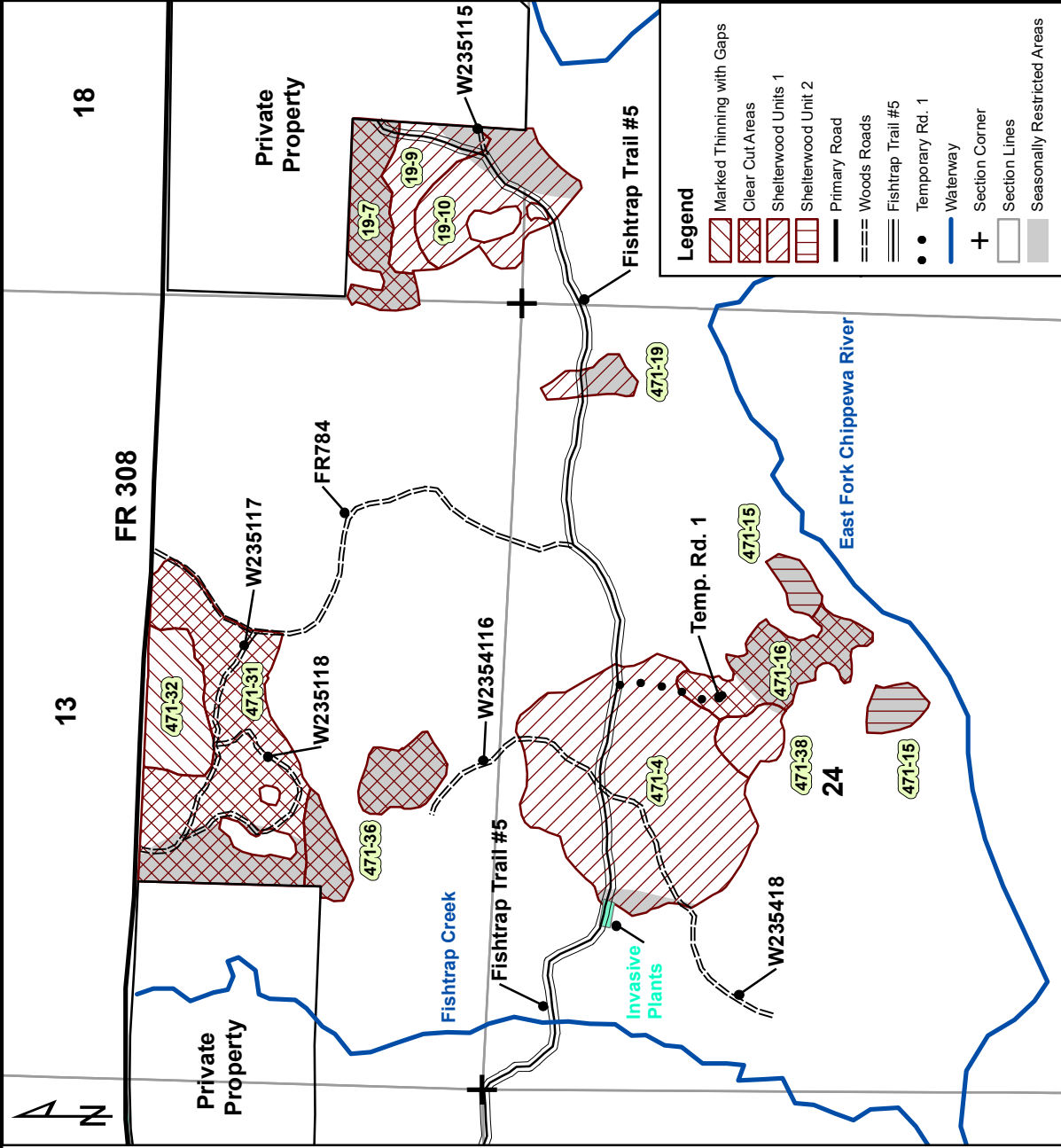
- Harvest all Balsam Fir, and White Spruce containing 1 or more pulpsticks. In addition, harvest all other trees greater than 2" except for Oaks, Pines, Hemlock, Yellow Birch, Cedar, and trees marked with **Orange Paint**.

Shelterwood Units 1: (C.19 S.9, S.10, C.471 S.4, S.19, S.38) 85 acres

- Harvest all trees greater than 2" except for Aspen, Oaks, Pines, Hemlock, Cedar, Yellow Birch, and trees marked with **Orange Paint**.

Shelterwood Unit 2: (C.471 S.15) 5 acres.

- Harvest all trees greater than 2" except for Oaks, Pines, Hemlock, Cedar, Yellow Birch, and trees marked with **Orange Paint**.

- Red Maple conversion rate is 2.275 tons per cord.
- Sugar Maple conversion rate is 2.55 tons per cord.
- Ash conversion rate is 2.30 tons per cord.
- White Birch conversion rate is 2.40 tons per cord.
- Yellow Birch conversion rate is 2.675 tons per cord.
- Red Oak conversion rate is 2.75 tons per cord.

*Mixed Hardwood pulpwood volume is estimated 32.5% Sugar Maple, 33.3% Red Maple, 27.7% White Birch, 3.8% Ash, 1.7% Yellow Birch, and 1.3% Red Oak.

*Mixed Hardwood sawtimber volume is estimated 62.5% White Birch, 12.5% Ash, 9.4% Sugar Maple, 9.4% Red Maple, and 6.3% Red Oak.



Harvest Requirements

Marked Thinning with Gaps (10 acres) – Harvest all trees marked with **Blue Paint**. Canopy Gaps: Bounded by **Purple Paint**. Harvest all trees greater than 1” except for Oaks, Pines, Hemlock, Yellow Birch, and Cedar. Do not harvest Purple Painted trees.

Clear Cut Areas (70 acres) – Harvest all Balsam Fir and White Spruce containing 1 or more pulpsticks. In addition, harvest all other trees greater than 2” except for Oaks, Pines, Hemlock, Yellow Birch, Cedar, and trees marked with **Orange Paint**.

Shelterwood Units 1 (85 acres) – Harvest all trees greater than 2” except for Aspen, Oaks, Pines, Hemlock, Cedar, Yellow Birch and trees marked with **Orange Paint**.

Shelterwood Unit 2 (5 acres) – Harvest all trees greater than 2” except for Oaks, Pines, Hemlock, Cedar, Yellow Birch and trees marked with **Orange Paint**.

Sale is bounded by **Orange and Red Paint**. Do not harvest trees or operate equipment across painted boundary lines.

Design Features and Mitigation Measures

- The harvesting of any portion of a tree that lies outside the physical ownership of the Forest Service will not be allowed. Trees lying across the property line must be bucked at the ownership line and all portions of the tree that reside on the private side of the line must be left in place. Conversely, the remaining portion of the tree that lies within the physical ownership of the Forest Service may be harvested and utilized.
- Equipment must be inspected by sale administrator and clean of dirt and debris before entering sale area. Non-Native invasive species, Reed Canary Grass, occur along Fishtrap Trail #5 at the western edge of C.471 S.4. Operating equipment within this ROW may be prohibited, unless treated, depending on seasonality of harvest.
- Use of heavy equipment during excessively wet weather will be limited. This will be controlled during project administration.
- Seasonally Restricted Areas: No harvest within these areas from April 1st through October 1st.
- Reserve all snags unless they pose a safety concern.
- Utilization will be to a 4” top.
- Provide for an average of 1 ruffed grouse drumming log for every 10 acres of aspen in the Clear Cut Areas. The log should be 10 or more inches in diameter and at least 12 feet long.

The following are specific slash requirements:

- Maintain 10-foot-wide slash-free zones adjacent to FR308, FR784, Fishtrap Trail #5, W235416, and W235418.
- All slash must be kept clear of travel ways, removed for the area 10 feet from Private Property and kept out of wetlands.
- Slash should not exceed 2 feet in height. Visible portions of timber harvesting, or other vegetation removal areas should receive the primary emphasis for slash treatment.

The following are specific road requirements:

- Chequamegon-Nicolet Forest Plan requires that all native surfaced approaches to paved or graveled roads have 100 ft. of gravel, 6 in. deep and 12 ft. wide put down when used during non-frozen conditions.
- All landings and skid trails will be blocked to vehicular access and possibly re-seeded at the conclusion of use if needed.
- Purchaser required to post signs on USFS roads alerting the public of harvesting/hauling activities.
- All road maintenance and rehabilitation post-harvest is the purchaser’s responsibility. A sample contract including road maintenance specifications can be obtained by request.
- The location and clearing widths of all Temporary Roads shall be agreed to in writing before construction is started. “Temporary Roads” are roads other than Specified Roads that are constructed by Purchaser for the purpose of harvesting included timber.
- Temporary Roads shall have the road base constructed to a width of 12 feet or narrower, and with vegetative clearing of trees and brush not to exceed a width of 25 feet. Exceptions to the 12-foot maximum width of the road base may be



granted by the sale administrator. Exceptions would typically be granted for sections of temporary roads where tight turns, curves, and terrain create a need so that trucks and equipment can be operated safely.

- No decking on town roads without township permission. Certain townships require written permission. This document will be required in selected townships.
- Road ID's W235115, W235117, W235118, and Temporary Roads will be required to be closed with rock, debris, and/or earthen berm following the harvest by the purchaser.
- Road ID's W235115, W235117, W235118, and Temporary Roads are to be properly decommissioned following the harvest by the purchaser. Road decommissioning must render a road inaccessible to all motorized traffic, including all-terrain vehicles. Effectively preventing motorized vehicles from gaining access at several points along the road. Render a road inaccessible by reclaiming the first 300 feet by placing natural obstructions in the road in such a way that they appear visually haphazard but effectively restrict access.

The following are specific trail requirements:

- For protection of the Fishtrap ATV/Snowmobile Trail #5: No hauling activities allowed during spring closure (March 15-April 30), on weekends or holidays (weekends are Friday 6PM through Sunday at midnight; holidays include Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve, Christmas, New Year's Eve and New Year's day). Where groomed trails are utilized for haul routes for winter operations, a mat of hard packed snow will be maintained on the trail at all times, except on short segments of steep (>15%) slopes. Skidding or forwarding will not be allowed on designated snowmobile trails during snow cover, except to cross at right angles at designated crossings.

Additional Requirements

- This contract period is approximately 3 years. **Contract ending date is June 30th, 2029.**
- Sale will be billed using mill ticket system.
- No bid bond required, a performance bond of 15% of the total sale bid value will be required.
- **NO SALE MAY BEGIN WITHOUT PRIOR NOTIFICATION AND AN ON-SITE MEETING WITH A WISCONSIN DNR SALE ADMINISTRATOR.**
- **C.471 S.19 requires pre-harvest scarification.** Site preparation will be performed by WDNR equipment and staff the fall of 2025 or prior to any harvest operations.
