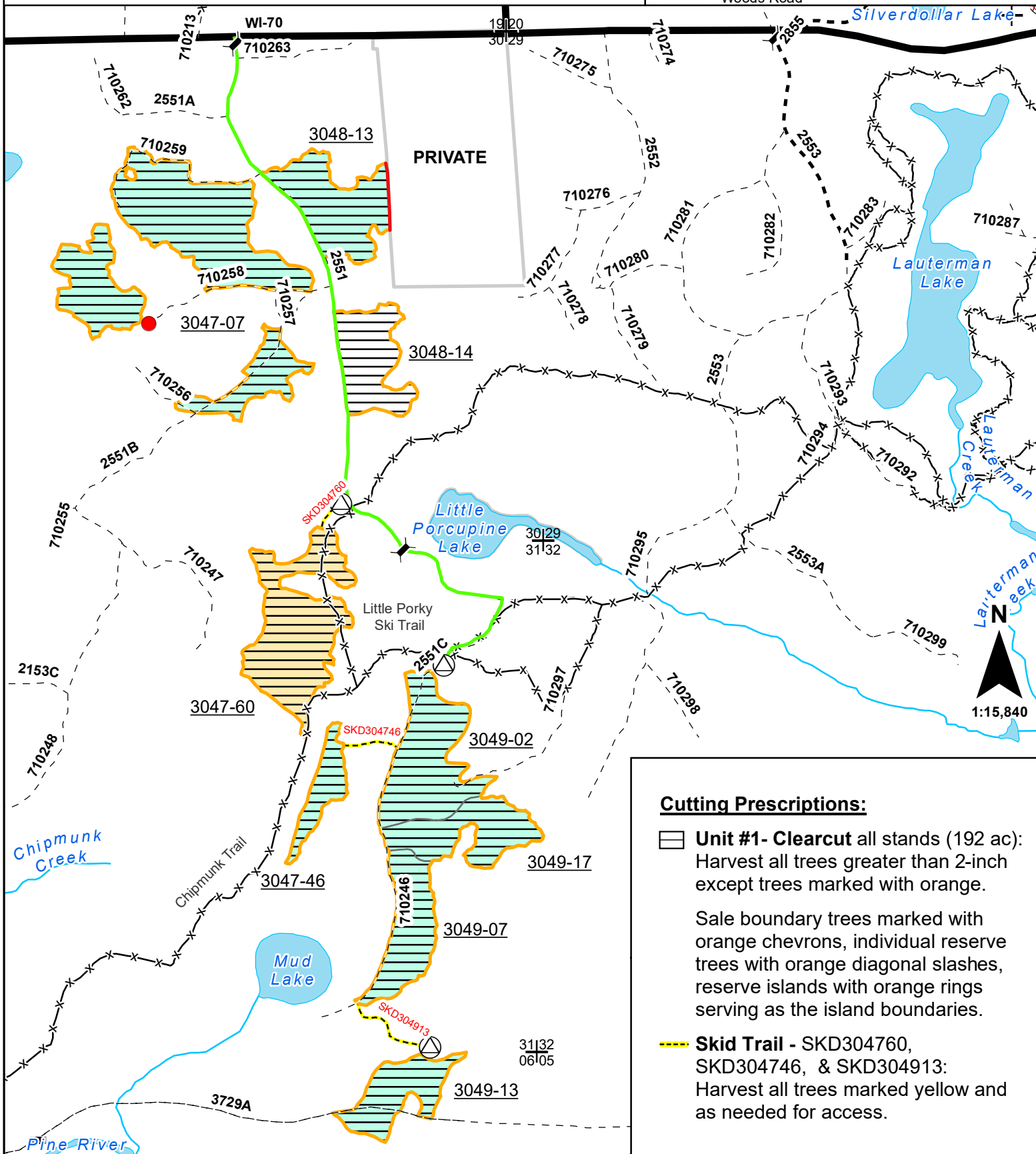



Volume estimates were obtained using 'ForestMetrix' volume estimating system. Wild Rivers State Lands base stumpage rates used for product values.

1. Aspen pulp: Contains 5% balsam poplar
2. Mixed conifer pulp: 43% black spruce, 42% white spruce, 14% balsam fir, and 1% white pine
3. Mixed hardwood pulp: 48% hard maple, 28% black cherry, 13% elm, 4% ash, 3% white birch, 2% ironwood, and 2% red maple
4. Comingled red pine: 70% logs and 30% pulp
5. Mixed hardwood logs: 70% black cherry, 18% white birch, 7% red maple, and 5% elm

**Tree Marking and Boundary Designations:**

- Orange: leave or boundary trees
- Red: private property boundary
- Yellow: skid route cut trees

**Cutting Prescriptions:**

**Unit #1- Clearcut** all stands (192 ac): Harvest all trees greater than 2-inch except trees marked with orange.

Sale boundary trees marked with orange chevrons, individual reserve trees with orange diagonal slash, reserve islands with orange rings serving as the island boundaries.

**Skid Route** - SKD304760, SKD304746, SKD304913: Harvest all trees marked in yellow, as needed for access.

**Seasonal Restrictions:**

- **Harvesting/hauling may only occur under frozen ground in Stands 3047-7, 46; 3048-13; 3049-2, 7, 13, 17.**
- Harvesting may occur under dry-firm-frozen ground in Stands 3047-60 (After October 1<sup>st</sup>) & 3048-14, at the discretion of the sale administrator.
- **No hauling or skidding allowed on ski trails except along designated haul route and at skid crossings.**
  - Haul route overlaps ski trail along access to 710246 and the southern block.
  - In Stand 3047-60, late fall or early winter harvesting is preferred to avoid a ski trail closure.
  - Two crossings perpendicular to the ski trail are allowed to access the eastern portions of Stand 3047-60.
- All pine products cut between May 1<sup>st</sup> and September 1<sup>st</sup> must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before May 1<sup>st</sup>.

**General Harvest Information:**

- The contract period ends **June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2029.**
- No bid bond required. A performance bond of 15% of the total sale bid value will be required.
- No sale work may begin without prior notification and an on-site meeting with the sale administrator.
- Reasonable care shall be taken to avoid unnecessary damage to residual trees and regeneration.
- Billing for pulp and any bolt products will use a mill scale ticket system. Logs may be mill scaled or field scaled, at the discretion of the timber sale administrator.
- Do not cut standing dead trees unless they pose an operational hazard.
- Utilization to at least a 4-inch top.
- The harvesting of any portion of a tree that lies outside the physical ownership of the Forest Service will not be allowed. Trees lying across the property line must be bucked at the ownership line and all portions of the tree that reside on the private side of the line must be left in place. Conversely, the remaining portion of the tree that lies within the physical ownership of the Forest Service may be harvested and utilized.
- Equipment must be cleaned and inspected before entering and leaving sale area to prevent the introduction or spread of invasive species.
- All slash shall be pulled 10 feet from the edge of all roads, trails, wetlands and riparian areas, and shall be lopped and scattered to lie within **2 feet of the ground for 150 feet from ski trails.**
- All other slash shall be lopped and scattered to lie within **4 feet of the ground.**

### Roads and Skid Trails:

- **Hunter-Walking Trails are present throughout this sale.** These trails may be used for timber sale access but must be left slash and rut-free post-harvest to facilitate future mowing. Purchaser required to post signs on public trails and roads entering active harvest areas alerting recreationists of harvest activities.
- **Invasives along haul route:** Due to the presence of garlic mustard, roads/trails south of second gate may only be used when frozen.
- Chequamegon-Nicolet Forest Plan requires that all native surfaced approaches to paved or graveled roads have 100 feet of gravel, 6 inches deep and 12 feet wide when used non-frozen.
- Any new temporary roads or turn-arounds will need approval by the timber sale admin.
- The location and clearing widths of all Temporary Roads shall be agreed to in writing before construction is started. "Temporary Roads" are roads other than Specified Roads that are constructed by Purchaser for harvesting included timber.
- Temporary Roads shall have the road base constructed to a width of 12 feet or narrower, and with vegetative clearing of tree and brush not to exceed a width of 25 feet. Exceptions to the 12-foot maximum width of the road base may be granted by the sale administrator. Exceptions would typically be granted for sections of temporary roads where tight turns, curves, and terrain create a need so that trucks and equipment can be operated safely.
- **The following roads must be double-bermed after use: 710246** (near the northern edge of stand 3049-02), **SKD304913** (near the northern edge of stand 3049-13), and **SKD304760** (at the intersection of 2551). To double-berm roads as required, Purchaser shall, at locations designated by the Sale Administrator, construct **two berms** at approximately 75-foot intervals with scattered slash and logging debris between the mounds. Berms shall be at least 4 feet in height and shall be made with dirt mixed with rocks, stumps, logs, root-wads, or slash and shall be constructed without creating a defined trench.
- All road maintenance and rehabilitation post-harvest is the purchaser's responsibility. Please refer to the sample contract for this sale for specific road maintenance specifications.

- Purchaser shall maintain roads, commensurate with Purchaser's use. Roads must be left in as good or better condition than existed prior to harvest. Performance of road maintenance work by Purchaser may be required prior to, during, or after each period of use. The timing of work accomplishment shall be based on Purchaser's operating schedule and road conditions. Specific required road maintenance specifications are included below.

- **T-8110: Maintenance Blading/Grading** is keeping an aggregate surfaced roadbed in a condition to facilitate traffic and provide proper drainage. It includes maintaining the crown, inslope or outslope of the traveled way, turnouts, and shoulder; repairing berms; blending approach road intersections; and cleaning drainage dips and lead-off ditches.
- **T-8130: Spot Surface Course Placement/Replenishment** includes subgrade preparation, furnishing, hauling, spreading, and shaping materials in accordance with the requirements.
- **T-8420: Cutting Roadway Vegetation** includes removal of brush, trees and other vegetative growth from within the clearing limits. This may include brush mowing of shoulders to prevent larger growth which would inhibit travel in the future.
- **T-8620: Miscellaneous Maintenance** includes maintenance of miscellaneous structures includes cattle guards, gates (this includes all types of closure devices such as logs, rocks, dirt berms, dirt and slash berms, metal gates, etc), signs, and other similar structures that have been previously installed to insure safe and efficient operation of the road.
