Timber for Sale - Invitation for Bids

Sealed bids will be received by the Black River State Forest Property Manager at the Black River State Forest Headquarters (Castle Mound), W10325 Hwy 12, Black River Falls, Wisconsin 54615; up to 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, April 26, 2018. A timber sale prospectus, map, bid forms and detailed information on each timber tract can be obtained by the internet at: http://dnr.wi.gov/topic/TimberSales/salesBlackRiver.html or by contacting the Forester at the above address, or by calling 715-284-4108.

Results from the bid opening and information on any un-sold tracts can be obtained by checking our website or calling the number listed above. Tracts not sold on April 26, 2018 will be available for re-bid up to 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, May 3, 2018.

The Department of Natural Resources reserves the right to reject any or all bids. Bids will be opened publicly at the Black River State Forest Headquarters (Castle Mound), Black River Falls, at 9:00 a.m. on April 26, 2018 and May 3, 2018.

Tract Information

There are six tracts of timber for sale on the Black River State Forest in T20N-R2W, T21N-R2W, T22N-R2W and T22N-R3W. The tracts comprise 498 acres and contain an estimated 14,270 tons of pine and hardwood pulp.

Additionally, there is one tract of timber for sale on Other State Lands in T19N-R6W. The tract comprises 62 acres and contains an estimated 2220 tons of pine and hardwood pulp volume. For questions regarding Other State Lands (tract#1-18), contact Clint Gilman at: 715-284-1410.

These timber sales are third party certified.

Bidding Requirements

All bids must be submitted as sealed bids, in individual envelopes for each tract, and labeled with the tract number. Use Department Timber Sale Bid Form (updated 2016 version 2400-49) and include the following:

- 1. Tract number
- 2. List of all species to be cut, utilization specifications (4" top for all sales in this bid opening), and estimated volumes as listed on the timber sale prospectus.
- 3. Bid price per unit for each species and product listed. No "zero" bids for any species will be accepted.
- 4. Check off the type of performance bond to be used in the appropriate box on the bid form.
- 5. Signature, address and phone number of bidder. E-mail contact information is optional.
- 6. Lump sum bids will not be accepted.
- 7. **Bids must be legible and accurate**. If we cannot determine the price per unit, totals, or other required information, your bid may not be accepted.
- 8. At any time prior to the reading aloud of any bids for a particular sale, bidders may withdraw their bid from consideration. This can be done in person or by written instruction to the Superintendant or DNR Forester conducting the bid opening.

**No Bid Bonds are required for this bid opening. However, if the winning bidder fails to execute the contract and submit an acceptable performance bond, the bidder shall be required to forfeit to the department an amount equal to 10% of the total bid amount. Failure to forfeit the 10% penalty will result in the bidder being considered ineligible to bid on any state timber sales for a two-year period.

All sawlog volumes are included with the tonnage volume estimates, unless noted otherwise, but estimates are listed on the prospectus. All Black River State Forest Sales will be scaled by the ton or converted to tons (from either cords or board feet) by the conversion rates in the contract.

Additional Requirements

Performance Bond of a minimum of \$1,000.00 or 15% of the total bid value is required upon the signing of a timber sale contract. Contracts must be signed within 2 weeks of the bid opening and performance bonds **must be**

received within 6 weeks of the bid opening. An Irrevocable Letter of Credit issued as a Performance Bond will be required to be 4 years in length. Letters of Credit for sales awarded this bid opening should be written to expire on January 1, 2022. If this is not possible through your lender, contact the DNR Forester as soon as possible for other options.

Worker's Compensation Law: The contractor (purchaser) shall provide the Department with an original Certificate of Insurance indicating that Worker's Compensation Insurance coverage is provided for all of the contractor's (purchaser's) employees working under the contract during its duration. This shall be in the Department's file prior to any performance under the contract. The purchaser shall notify the Department in writing, immediately upon any change in or cancellation of insurance coverage required under the contract.

Payments: Timber will not be removed from any sale area until paid for or a satisfactory guarantee for payment is made. However, qualifying contractors have the option to sign a contract under the deferred payment program. Under this option, payment shall be received at the payment lock box in Milwaukee or by the DNR Forester within 30 days from billing. (**Deferred payment is not allowed with lump sum sales**.) Late payment—Failure to pay within the 30-day period shall result in:

- The contractor being required to prepay stumpage on the remainder of the sale.
- The payment breach being documented by forwarding the contractor's name to the County Forest Specialist in Madison.
- A 1.5% every 30 days late interest penalty being assessed on stumpage due.

Sales Tax Exempt Status: The purchaser must also furnish a completed copy of the Department of Revenue Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate. (New filing requirement for DNR timber sales in 2016.)

Training Requirement: The purchaser is responsible for ensuring that the actual logging contractor complies with the Wisconsin SFI training standard as adopted by the SFI Implementation Committee (SIC). Criteria for the standards can be found at the Web site: www.fistausa.org/sfi_standards.html, or by contacting the Forest Industry Safety & Training Alliance (FISTA). Purchaser must provide documentation to Seller that training has been attained.

For timber sales that require stump treatment for Heterobasidian Root Disease (Annosum), treatment must be performed by a Certified Pesticide Applicator through Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection. **Proof of Certification will be required prior to beginning any areas requiring treatment.** More information can be found at: http://datcp.wi.gov/Plants/Pesticides/Licenses/Commercial Applicator Certification. Reporting of type and amount of chemical used will be required.



Black River State Forest General Sale Conditions

The following conditions apply on all timber sales unless otherwise stated on the individual timber sale prospectus.

Contracts and Extensions:

- 1. All contracts will be issued for a period of 2 years, unless otherwise noted. It is understood that all contracts are expected to be completed during the initial contract. Extensions are not automatic.
- 2. Requests for extensions must be submitted prior to the expiration date of the contract. The performance bond may be retained if requests are not submitted by the expiration date.

Cutting and Utilization:

- 1. All designated species for harvest must be cut concurrently within the sale. This includes any non-merchantable 2-4" dbh trees if designated. Care must be taken to not damage any residual trees.
- 2. All decked or cut pine must be removed from the sale area within 3 weeks of cutting from March 1st to August 30th to prevent bark beetle damage, this includes red pine, jack pine and white pine. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15th.
- 3. No scarring or debarking of residual trees from harvesters or skidders in excess of 10% on red pine plantations being thinned for the first time, or in excess of 3% on plantations thinned second, third, or fourth times.
- 4. Oak trees may not be cut during the period April 1st to July 15th to prevent oak wilt infestation, unless specified otherwise in the prospectus. Other exceptions may be considered on a case by case basis.
- 5. Pulpwood: Cut all designated trees with one (1) or more 100" sticks to a 4" top diameter for hardwoods and softwoods, unless sold as a whole tree harvest. Only sales advertised with whole tree harvest volumes are eligible for whole tree utilization. Whole tree harvests require 10% of topwood (<4" diameter) volume to be left scattered in the sale area and Wisconsin's Forestland Woody Biomass Harvesting Guidelines must be followed.
- 6. Sawlogs: Cut all designated trees with one (1) or more 8'6" logs to a top diameter of 10" for hardwoods and 9" for softwoods.

Roads, Trails, and Landings:

- 1. The location and building of roads and landings are always subject to advanced approval and conditions of the seller (DNR Forester). A DNR Forester must be contacted at least 48 hours in advance for an appointment.
- 2. All logging debris accumulated at landings, including bark, tops, and slash, shall be scattered within the sale area to the satisfaction of the seller.
- 3. Berms (piles of dirt, debris, stumps, slash, etc.) constructed on the seller's property (Black River State Forest) shall be leveled to restore the area to the seller's satisfaction unless they are constructed at the direction of the seller. (In other words, do not pile or push dirt up with debris and slash around the edge of landings or along trails and roads, especially against standing trees and the edges of dense woods.)
- 4. Any road work or maintenance involving more than leveling / grading must be pre-approved by a DNR Forester. No borrow pits will be allowed.
- 5. Roads and landings shall be graded and leveled upon completion of the timber sale and restored to seller's satisfaction. Any trees pushed over or cut down for making roads or landings must be utilized or cleaned up to the DNR Forester's satisfaction.

Aesthetic & Ecological Considerations:

The seller reserves the right to change (add or subtract) marked or designated timber to be cut at anytime for aesthetic, ecological, BMP's or to protect endangered resources without mutual agreement of the buyer provided it does not affect 10% or more of the estimated volume.

The purchaser shall comply with all recommended Forestry BMPs for Invasive Species as described in "Wisconsin's Forestry Best Management Practices for Invasive Species" published by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, publication Pub-FR-444-09, unless specifically provided otherwise.

Specifically: BMP 4.4: Prior to moving equipment onto and off of a harvest area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces, to the extent practical, to minimize the risk of transporting invasive species.

Preferred locations for cleaning equipment areas are those where:

- Equipment is unloaded and loaded.
- Invasives are less likely to spread from cleaned equipment (such as undisturbed areas).
- Invasive species are already established
- Equipment with the ability to run fans in reverse should use this feature to clean air intakes. Fans and air intakes can harbor plant materials and insects. Reversing the fan direction and blowing loose material out of equipment before leaving a site can reduce the likelihood of moving species to another site. Heat exhausted from the engine when fans are reversed may kill some insects and plant parts.
- In areas where invasive species are present, it is a good practice to routinely remove soil, seeds, vegetative matter, or other debris from shoes, clothing, and tools.

Scaling Specification:

- 1. The mill scale ticket system will be required for pulp and logs, unless otherwise stated in the prospectus. Contractor is required to deposit a scale ticket in the lock box placed on the sale. These tickets are provided by the State Forest and will be filled out in their entirety. The contractor is also required to deliver a mill ticket to the mill purchasing the forest product. This mill ticket will be returned to the Black River State Forest along with a copy of the mill's scale. The contractor is responsible for having these mill tickets and scale slips returned to the Black River State Forest within 14 days of hauling. **The contractor may not scale his own wood without authorization from the DNR Forester.** An independent mill scale or weight or DNR scale shall be used at all times.
- 2. The seller reserves the right and may for any reason, decide to stick scale all products on the sale area. The contractor may also put in a request for stick scaling with at least 48 hours advance notice for reasonable circumstances.
- 3. Contractors that are required to prepay must at a minimum, purchase 5 or more scale tickets at a time, but it is encouraged that a full booklet of 25 scale tickets be purchased.
- 4. When there is no sawlog volume listed on the timber sale prospectus, bolts and logs may be scaled as cordwood. Scale sheets with tie logs or board feet volumes (using the Scribner Decimal "C" log rule) will be converted to cordwood volume using standard DNR conversion factors.
- 5. Pine and hardwood sawbolts, which normally would have been cut into sawlogs, will be scaled by weight (tons) or by the cord. The conversion factor for cordwood to MBF is 2.44 cords per MBF for softwoods, and 2.20 cords per MBF for hardwoods.
- 6. When peeled cordwood is measured, it is agreed that 12.5% will be added to hand peeled and stroke delimber/processor peeled volume and 16% to ring debarked volume.
- 7. Lump Sum Sales require pre-payment for the entire sale amount prior to any harvesting or work on the sale begins. See individual prospectus for specifics on each sale.

Weight Conversion Factors: All wood will be scaled by the ton or converted to tons, unless advertised otherwise.

The following weight conversion factors will be used in the conversion of a standard 4' x 4' x 100" cord to tons. Factors for a mix of species may be developed by weighted average of cruise estimates based on species volume distribution and/or ocular estimate.

Survey Corners:

Do not damage any survey corners or witness trees. No witness trees may be cut. It is the sale purchaser's responsibility to pay for costs of damage, removal, or repair to any land survey monuments or accessories.

Slash: (including leaning trees due to damage by skidders or harvesters)

- 1. Slash falling in any lake, stream, marsh, flowage, road right-of-way, or on adjoining land shall be removed immediately and pulled back at least 10 feet inside the sale boundary.
- 2. All trees shall be completely felled and not left leaning or hanging in other trees. Tops from felled trees may not be left hanging in standing trees.
- 3. Slash must be evenly scattered across the sale area to within 2 feet of the ground concurrently with cutting. No large piles are allowed. Slash along state highways, county, town, and state forest roads, and recreational trails, must be pulled back a minimum of 10 feet within the sale edge.
- 4. Trees cut along the edges of any marsh, creeks, or flowages by harvesting machines must be felled to high ground to keep the slash out of wet areas. Machines operating along marshes, creeks or flowages must remain on high ground during the cutting to prevent rutting in wetlands. Do not cut across or through small marshes or wetlands with equipment, but rather work around them.
- 5. No slash is to be piled on any existing pine (red, white, or jack) reproduction in the understory. Do not bury seedlings and saplings.

Soil Disturbance and Rutting:

- a. The Purchaser agrees to take all steps and precautions to avoid and minimize soil disturbances, such as soil compaction and rutting. If soil disturbances occur, the Purchaser agrees to work cooperatively to mitigate and repair any and all instances of soil disturbance.
- b. Excessive soil disturbance (as defined in Table 1) shall not be permitted. Purchaser agrees to contact Seller in the event of an excessive soil disturbance.

c. Prior to sale completion the Purchaser shall mitigate and repair soil disturbances to the Seller's satisfaction.

Heterobasidian Root Disease (Annosum) Treatment: (Only for sales that require it and when cut between April 1 and November 30.) Harvest areas listed as requiring treatment must be treated concurrently with harvesting by a DATCP Certified Pesticide Applicator. Proof of Certification will be required. Stumps must be treated within 12 hours of cutting. Blue dye (such as Hi-Light) shall be added to the liquid chemical treatment in a manner consistent with the label. The DNR forester may inspect any or all stumps and must be able to validate that treatment has been done successfully. Slash, sawdust and other debris shall be kept off treated stumps so that these inspections can be done. The DNR reserves the right to inspect and test the contractor's chemical tank at any time during the harvesting operations to make sure that proper treatment procedures are being followed. Missed stumps, poor chemical coverage, or stumps that are inaccessible for inspection may be considered a contract violation and may lead to termination of harvesting operations until the situation can be remedied to the satisfaction of the DNR. Additionally, the type and amount of chemical used will need to be reported to the DNR on forms provided by the Department.

Purpose of Sale:

A mix of coppice harvests to regenerate new oak growth while leaving large oaks as a seed source, as well as to regenerate aspen pockets and promote a variety of forest age classes on the property.

Cutting Specifications: (See tracts marked on map)

Tract 1 – Cut all trees >2" diameter except for trees marked with green paint.

Tract 2 – Cut all trees > 2" diameter except for trees marked with green paint.

Tract 3 – Cut all trees >2" diameter except for all Oak species.

Special Operating Requirements and Slash Disposal:


- 1. This sale is located mainly on dry ground. All stands should be harvested during dry or frozen ground conditions. Care should be taken to avoid rutting and soil compaction.
- 2. The sale harvest boundaries are marked with red paint as well as blue paint. Blue paint lines are property boundaries to private lands. Do not fell trees across blue paint lines and do not cut painted boundary trees.
- 3. No biomass harvesting is allowed on this sale due to unsuitable soil types.
- 4. All pine products cut between March 1st and August 30 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting to control bark beetle populations. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15th.
- 5. No recreational trails run through the sale area, but all roads used by logging equipment should be left in good condition. Two private driveway easements lead to sale areas and shall be left in good condition once sale is harvested. Final condition of these roads will be to the satisfaction of the DNR forester and wildlife property manager.
- 6. Slash must be evenly lopped/scattered within the sale boundary and shall be deposited a minimum of 10 feet from the mowed right-of-way of any highway, town road, or recreational trail. Slash within 50 feet of all town roads and recreational trails must lie within 2 feet of the ground. Do not bury seedlings or saplings with slash.

- 1. All landings must be approved by a DNR forester before operations begin.
- 2. All designated tree species must be cut and forwarded concurrently with the sale.
- 3. All stumps shall be no higher than the stump diameter, or 10 inches, whichever is less.
- 4. Do not cut or knock down any dead or hollow trees. These are important wildlife habitat. Any that must be cut shall be left in big pieces on the forest floor.
- 5. Utilization: cut and use all designated trees with one or more 100" sticks to a 4" top diameter.
- 6. Notify the DNR forester before you start the job, and each time you pull out or return to the job.
- 7. Any new roads and all landings must be approved by a DNR forester before operations begin.
- 8. Any berms removed during harvesting operations must be put back to the satisfaction of the DNR Forester.
- 9. Any trees cut or pushed over for new roads or landings must be utilized or cleaned up to the DNR Forester's satisfaction.

Purpose of Sale: To thin the white pine and remove mature short-lived species.

Special Operating Requirements and Slash Disposal:

- 1. This sale has no seasonal restrictions, but has several low drainages. These areas will need to be avoided unless the ground is frozen. Most of these areas can be worked around except during very wet conditions.
- 2. Access to the sale is over a woods road, part of which is a Jackson County Forest Rd. Generally this road is <u>not</u> allowed to be used during spring break up for hauling. Permission from both the State Forest and Jackson County Forestry would be required to use this road during wet conditions.
- 3. The sale boundaries are red and blue paint lines, and an open keg. Do not cut painted boundary trees. Do not fell trees across blue paint line.
- 4. All pine products cut between March 1st and August 30 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15th.
- 5. Slash must be evenly lopped/scattered within the sale boundary and shall be deposited a minimum of 10 feet from the mowed right-of-way of any highway, town road, or recreational trail. Slash within 50 feet of all town roads and recreational trails must lie within 2 feet of the ground. Do not bury seedlings or saplings with slash.





BLACK RIVER STATE FOREST TIMBER SALE MAP T22N-R3W Sec 34, 35 TRACT #10-18 Koranda Pines




Purpose of Sale: To thin three red pine plantations for the third time, and to convert 4 acres of red pine to white pine and oak.

Special Operating Requirements and Slash Disposal:

- 1. The sale boundaries are the edges of pine plantations and the road or trail.
- 2. No use of, or crossing the ski trails with equipment during times when the trail is groomed for skiing.
- 3. Any slash or debris dropped onto the ski trails must be promptly removed for safety of recreational users. <u>These trails are open for hiking and biking whenever not groomed for skiing.</u>
- 4. No biomass harvesting is allowed on this sale due to poor soil fertility.
- 5. All pine products cut between March 1st and August 30 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15th.
- 6. Slash must be evenly lopped/scattered within the sale boundary and shall be deposited a minimum of 10 feet from the mowed right-of-way of any highway, town road, or recreational trail. Slash within 50 feet of all town roads and recreational trails must lie within 2 feet of the ground. Do not bury seedlings or saplings with slash.

- 1. All designated tree species must be cut and forwarded concurrently with the sale.
- 2. All stumps shall be no higher than the stump diameter, or 10 inches, whichever is less.
- 3. Do not cut or knock down any dead or hollow trees. These are important wildlife habitat. Any that must be cut shall be left in big pieces on the forest floor.
- 4. <u>Utilization</u>: cut and use all designated trees with one or more 100" sticks to a 4" top diameter.
- 5. Notify the DNR forester before you start the job, and each time you pull out or return to the job.
- 6. Any new roads and all landings must be approved by a DNR forester before operations begin.
- 7. Any berms removed during harvesting operations must be put back to the satisfaction of the DNR Forester.
- 8. Any trees cut or pushed over for new roads or landings must be utilized or cleaned up to the DNR Forester's satisfaction.
- 9. The Township of Millston (phone #715-284-0913) must be notified prior to sale start-up.
- 10. Wisconsin's Best Management Practices for Invasive Species applies contractor must clean equipment before entering and leaving the sale area! This involves brushing away all dirt and cleaning air intakes of debris.
