**PUBLIC NOTICE  
Timber for Sale - Invitation for Bids**

Sealed bids will be received by the Black River State Forest Forester at the Black River State Forest Headquarters (Castle Mound), W10325 Hwy 12, Black River Falls, Wisconsin 54615; up to 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, May 18, 2021. A timber sale prospectus, map, bid forms and detailed information on each timber tract can be obtained on the internet at: <http://dnr.wi.gov/topic/TimberSales/salesBlackRiver.html> or by contacting the Forester at the above address, or by calling 715-410-8839.

**Please note that due to recommendations regarding COVID-19, this will be a “CLOSED” bid opening. The public and logging contractors may not attend in person, to ensure the health and safety of all.**

The Department of Natural Resources reserves the right to reject any or all bids. Bids will be opened at the Black River State Forest Headquarters (Castle Mound), Black River Falls, at 9:00 a.m. on May 18, 2020 and June 1, 2021. Interested parties may join the bid opening via conference call at: (608) 316-9000. Once connected, use passcode 5837944#.

**Tract Information**

There are seven tracts of timber for sale on the Black River State Forest in T20N-R2W, T21N-R2W, T22N-R2W and T21N-R4W. The tracts comprise 594 acres and contain an estimated 29,315 tons of pine and hardwood pulp and sawtimber. Additionally, there are four tracts of timber for sale on State Lands located in T21N-R6W, T24N-R4W, T18N-R3W and T19N-R4W on 192 acres with an estimated 5070 tons of pulp and sawtimber. These timber sales are third party certified.

Results from the bid opening and information on any un-sold tracts can be obtained by checking our website or calling the numbers listed above. Tracts not sold on Tuesday, May 18, 2021 will be available for re-bid up to 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, June 1, 2021.

**Bidding Requirements**

All bids must be submitted as sealed bids, in individual envelopes for each tract, and labeled with the tract number. Use Department Timber Sale Bid Form (updated 2020 version 2400-49) and include the following:

1. Tract number
2. List of all species to be cut, utilization specifications (4” top for all sales in this bid opening), and estimated volumes as listed on the timber sale prospectus.
3. Bid price per unit for each species and product listed. No “zero” bids for any species will be accepted.
4. Check off the type of performance bond to be used in the appropriate box on the bid form.
5. Signature, address and phone number of bidder. E-mail contact information is optional.
6. **Lump sum bids will not be accepted.**
7. **Bids must be legible and accurate. If we cannot determine the price per unit, totals, or other required information, your bid may not be accepted.**
8. At any time prior to the reading aloud of any bids for a particular sale, bidders may withdraw their bid from consideration. This can be done on the conference call or by written instruction to the DNR Forester conducting the bid opening.

**\*\*No Bid Bonds are required for this bid opening. However, if the winning bidder fails to execute the contract and submit an acceptable performance bond, the bidder shall be required to forfeit to the department an amount equal to 10% of the total bid amount. Failure to forfeit the 10% penalty will result in the bidder being considered ineligible to bid on any state timber sales for a two-year period.**

**\*All sawlog volumes are included with the tonnage volume estimates, unless noted otherwise, but estimates are listed on the prospectus. All Black River State Forest Sales will be scaled by the ton or converted to tons (from either cords or board feet) by the conversion rates in the contract. \***

**New for Spring 2021: All contracts will be for 3 years (expiration of June 30, 2024) unless otherwise noted on the sale prospectus. Any contract extensions would incur a 15% increase.**

**Heterobasidial Root Disease Treatment:** For timber sales that require stump treatment for Heterobasidial Root Disease (Annosum), treatment must be performed by a Certified Pesticide Applicator through Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection. **Proof of Certification will be required prior to beginning any areas requiring treatment.** More information can be found at: [http://datcp.wi.gov/Plants/Pesticides/Licenses/Commercial\\_Applicator\\_Certification](http://datcp.wi.gov/Plants/Pesticides/Licenses/Commercial_Applicator_Certification). Reporting of type and amount of chemical used will be required.

#### **Additional Requirements**

**Performance Bond** of a minimum of \$1,000.00 or 15% of the total bid value is required upon the signing of a timber sale contract. Contracts must be signed within 2 weeks of the bid opening and performance bonds **must be received within 6 weeks of the bid opening**. An Irrevocable Letter of Credit issued as a Performance Bond will be required to be 4 years in length. Letters of Credit for sales awarded this bid opening should be written to expire on **June 30, 2025**. **If this is not possible through your lender, contact the DNR Forester as soon as possible for other options.**

**Worker's Compensation Law:** The contractor (purchaser) shall provide the Department with an original Certificate of Insurance indicating that Worker's Compensation Insurance coverage is provided for all of the contractor's (purchaser's) employees working under the contract during its duration. This shall be in the Department's file prior to any performance under the contract. The purchaser shall notify the Department in writing, immediately upon any change in or cancellation of insurance coverage required under the contract.

**Payments:** Timber will not be removed from any sale area until paid for or a satisfactory guarantee for payment is made. However, qualifying contractors have the option to sign a contract under the deferred payment program. Under this option, payment shall be received at the payment lock box in Milwaukee or by the DNR Forester within 30 days from billing. **(Deferred payment is not allowed with lump sum sales.)**

Late payment—Failure to pay within the 30-day period shall result in:

- The contractor being required to prepay stumpage on the remainder of the sale.
- The payment breach being documented by forwarding the contractor's name to the County Forest Specialist in Madison.
- A 1.5% every 30 days late interest penalty being assessed on stumpage due.

**Sales Tax Exempt Status:** The purchaser must also furnish a completed copy of the Department of Revenue Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate. (New filing requirement for DNR timber sales in 2016.)

**Training Requirement:** The purchaser is responsible for ensuring that the actual logging contractor complies with the Wisconsin SFI training standard as adopted by the SFI Implementation Committee (SIC). Criteria for the standards can be found at the Web site: [www.fistausa.org/sfi\\_standards.html](http://www.fistausa.org/sfi_standards.html), or by contacting the Forest Industry Safety & Training Alliance (FISTA). Purchaser must provide documentation to Seller that training has been attained.

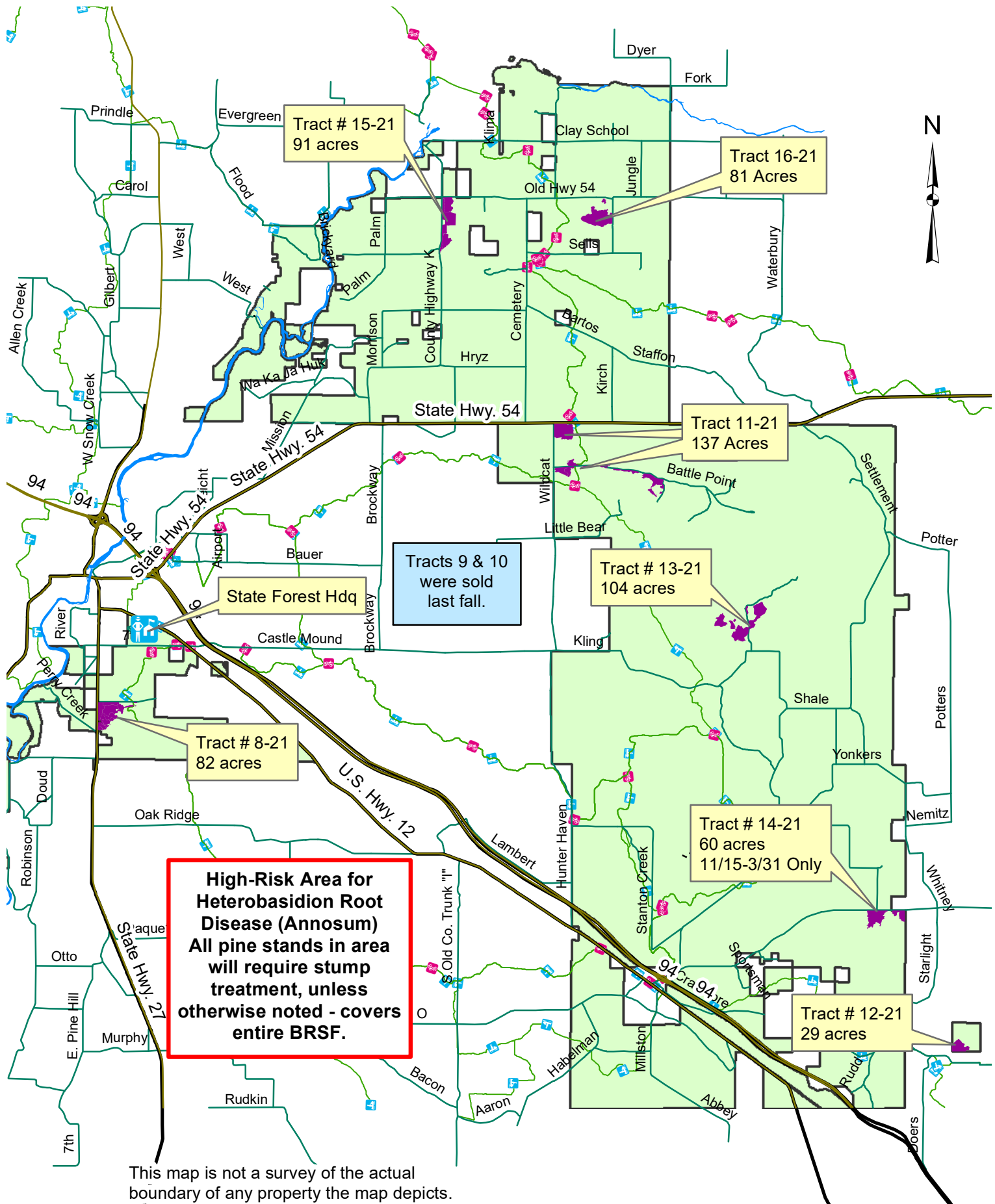

**Purpose of Sale:** Reduce stocking to recommended silvicultural levels and increase growth rates in the thinning units. Regenerate aspen, oak, and release advanced white pine regeneration in the regeneration harvest units.

**Special Operating Requirements and Slash Disposal:**

1. This sale is located within the 25-mile Heterobasidion Root Disease (HRD) area, and requires stump Treatment (with the exception of the 9 acre oak regeneration harvest unit and the 3 acre aspen regeneration harvest unit) unless harvested between December 1 and March 31. Treatment must be performed by a Certified Pesticide Applicator. Treatment involves chemically treating all fresh-cut stumps of pines of merchantable size by applying either CELLU-TREAT (disodium octaborate tetrahydrate) Rotstop C (biological fungicide). Treatment shall be made as soon as possible and no later than one day after harvest and a dye product shall be added to liquid solutions for inspection purposes. The cost of this application can vary based on application method and harvest conditions, but should be considered when submitting bids on these timber sales.
2. No operations are allowed until October 1, 2021 to allow time for treatment of invasive species.
3. Avoid damage to white pine seedlings/saplings in the oak and jack pine regeneration harvest units.
4. All pine products cut between March 1st and August 30 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15<sup>th</sup>.
5. Biomass harvesting is not allowed due to poor soils.
6. Most of this sale is located on dry ground, however pockets of low-lying ground exist within several of the harvest units. Care should be used to avoid these areas with equipment. The 4 acre white pine thinning unit (shaded in green) contains a seasonally intermittent stream less than 3' wide. Harvesting in this unit is restricted to dry or frozen ground only. This unit may be crossed with equipment at the existing trail and at one other location with either timber mats or a pole ford.
7. The sale boundaries are single-sided red paint line, double-sided red paint line, blue paint line, different cover types, Cranberry Drive, STH 27, ATV/snowmobile trail and the bike/hike trail. Do not cut painted boundary trees.
8. Slash must be evenly lopped/scattered within the sale boundary and shall be deposited a minimum of 10 feet from the mowed right-of-way of any highway, town road, or recreational trail. Slash within 50 feet of all town roads and recreational trails must lie within 2 feet of the ground. Do not bury seedlings or saplings with slash.

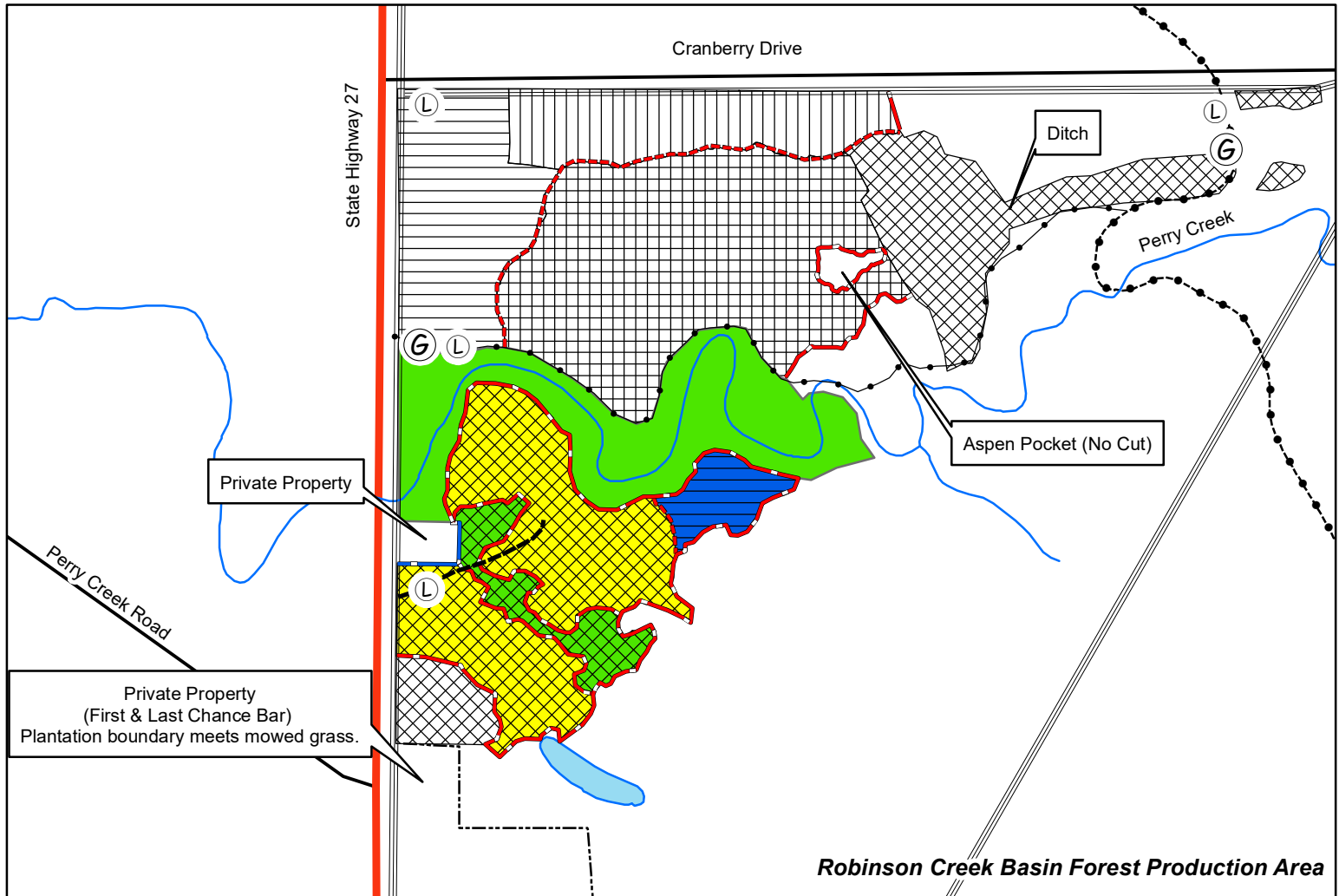
**General Requirements:**

1. All designated tree species must be cut and forwarded concurrently with the sale.
2. All stumps shall be no higher than the stump diameter, or 10 inches, whichever is less.
3. Do not cut or knock down any dead or hollow trees. These are important wildlife habitat. Any that must be cut shall be left in big pieces on the forest floor.
4. Utilization: cut and use all designated trees with one or more 100" sticks to a 4" top diameter.
5. Any new roads and all landings must be approved by a DNR forester before operations begin.
6. Any berms removed during harvesting operations must be put back to the satisfaction of the DNR Forester.
7. Notify the DNR forester before you start the job, and each time you pull out or return to the job.
8. Any trees cut or pushed over for new roads or landings must be utilized or cleaned up to the DNR Forester's satisfaction.
9. Contact the town of Brockway prior to beginning logging operations at 715-284-5234. Permits are required for hauling heavy loads on town roads and approvals are needed for any new driveway approaches.
10. Wisconsin's Best Management Practices for Invasive Species applies – contractor must clean equipment before entering and leaving the sale area! This involves brushing away all dirt and cleaning air intakes of debris.







BLACK RIVER STATE FOREST

TRACT #8-21 Cranberry Pine 2












TRACT #11-21 Battlepoint Oak & Pine**







