Tracts not sold on **July 17, 2019,** will be available for re-bid up to, but no later than **9:00 A.M. on Tuesday, August 20, 2019.**

BIDDER ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- The successful purchaser shall ensure that at least one in woods person actively engaged in performance of the timber sale contract and responsible for the logging site complies with **Wisconsin SFI (Sustainability Forestry Initiative) Training Standard** as adopted by the Wisconsin SFI Implementation Council (SCI). <http://fistausa.org/content/how-become-sfi-trained>.
- Proof of Worker's Compensation Insurance required.

BIDDING PROCEDURES:

- All bids must be submitted on the attached Timber Sale Bid form (Form 2400-049A) for each sale.
- Bidders bidding on more than one "tract" must submit separate sealed bids for each tract. **"Timber Sale SEALED BID" with SALE NAME and TRACT NUMBER** must be written on the outside of each separate envelope.
- **Bid Bond Not Required.** Winning bidders will have 6 weeks from the date of the bid opening to submit an acceptable performance bond to the department. If the winning bidder fails to execute the contract and submit an acceptable performance bond, the bidder shall be required to forfeit to the department an amount equal to 10% of the total bid amount. Failure to forfeit the 10% penalty will result in the bidder being considered ineligible to bid on any state timber sales for a two-year period.
- There is no guarantee of the quality or quantity of the wood products or volumes; therefore, bidders are encouraged to inspect each timber sale prior to bidding.
- An acceptable bid must have a price for each species and product listed for each sale.
- **The Department of Natural Resources reserves the right to reject ANY and ALL bids.**

CONTRACTS & EXENSIONS: *(sample contracts available upon request)*

- **A signed TIMBER SALE CONTRACT and PERFORMANCE BOND (15% of the total sale value), unless stated otherwise, is required within 6 weeks of the bid opening and before work is commenced.** An Irrevocable Letter of Credit issued as a performance bond must extend a **minimum** of 1 year past the contract ending date.
- **CONTRACT EXTENSIONS**, if granted, will be for 6 months in length (unless harvest restrictions necessitate a 1-year extension) with a potential initial 5% value increase in stumpage price and an additional 10% increase for every extension thereafter.
- Contracts may not be assigned.
- All sales are authorized for 30-day deferred payment for all qualified purchasers.
- A pre-sale meeting with the seller and purchaser is required before commencing work to include moving equipment on site. **Two-week notification is required**, although all attempts will be made to meet as soon as possible.

SCALING SPECIFICATIONS:

- Unless otherwise stated on the prospectus, sale methods will be by "mill scale" in conjunction with "haul" ticket system. Mixed loads of species and/or products, of different stumpage values, will be charged at the higher dollar value.

- Any firewood sold to a private entity must either be stick-scaled by DNR prior to leaving the timber sale or be sold via a triplicate ticket system. With the latter system, logger, landowner, and DNR will all receive a copy of each ticket. This will allow DNR to ensure the volume sold to the private entity is the same as that paid for by the contractor. Each triplicate ticket will have a unique assigned number for tracking purposes. Each ticket will also include the buyer’s name and contact information. Any such triplicate system shall be approved by DNR prior to initial implementation on a timber sale.

The following general items are common to all sales unless otherwise stated and are considered important to both the bidding process and successful contract compliance: (sample contracts available upon request)

- These lands are 3rd party certified.
- Please refer to the sale prospectus for specific contract periods.
- Oak Wilt Restrictions:** No cutting or skidding in stands managed for oak will be permitted from April 1-July15, unless otherwise noted on the prospectus. Restricted dates may vary based on current Oak Harvesting Guidelines.
- All Wisconsin BMP’s for water quality shall be followed.
- All equipment must be cleaned prior to entering and leaving the sale.
- Slash must be evenly scattered across the sale area to not exceed a height of 24” off the ground, unless otherwise noted.
- Harvesting of unmarked or undesignated timber or damage caused by negligence or carelessness will not be tolerated and shall result in double liability of the mill value.
- Landing and road locations must be approved by the DNR forester and/or property manager prior to construction. All existing trails and roads must be maintained or improved to pre-sale conditions.
- DNR will ensure access to the timber sale; however, access across private property (if desired) is the responsibility of the contractor.
- All pine cut from April 1 - September 1 must be hauled within 3 weeks of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be hauled prior to June 1 annually.
- Do not cut any boundary trees painted with red, blue, yellow, or purple paint **throughout the timber sale areas.**
- Heterobasidion root disease (Annosum root rot) Prevention Treatment: Unless otherwise stated on the prospectus, ALL sales requiring the cutting of conifers will also require the Purchaser to complete Heterobasidion root disease (Annosum root rot) preventive treatment from April 1 to November 30, or under unusually warm weather between December 1 thru March 31. Treatment involves chemically treating all fresh-cut stumps or significant wounds on conifers of merchantable size by applying Sporax (sodium tetraborate dcahydrate) or CELLU-TREAT (disodium octoborate tetrahydrate). Treatment shall be made within 24 hours of cutting and a dye product shall be added to liquid solutions for inspection purposes. Unless treated immediately after cutting and before the next tree is cut, ALL stumps shall remain clear of slash for application and administration purposes.**

- **Oak Woodland Restoration Area** (White backward diagonal lines, 93 ac.): Cut all trees marked on the bole and stump with **orange paint**, plus all stems of merchantable size of the following species: **aspen, ash, elm (including Siberian Elm), boxelder, and maple**. All merchantable **black cherry shall also be cut, except** for any cherry marked on the bole and stump with **green** paint.
- **Aspen Regeneration &/or Conversion Areas¹** (Forward green diagonal lines, 24 ac.): Cut all stems 2" DBH or greater², **except for any white or bur oaks or any trees marked on the bole and stump with green paint**.
- **Thinning Areas** (Orange crosshatched areas, 5 ac.): Cut all trees marked on the bole and stump with **orange paint, plus any merchantable ash trees**.


Contract and other Sale Requirements:

- **Contract Period:** Due to the presence of threatened or endangered species, harvest operations are limited to **October 16th through March 4th annually, except during the traditional 9-day gun deer season**. Harvest operations may begin in **October of 2020**. A 2-year contract will be utilized. The sale is being sold now so contractors can plan.
- ² Invasive plants and undesirable stems will be **forestry mowed** in all the Aspen Regeneration areas, except the SW-most "Aspen Regeneration &/or Conversion Area" pre-sale. A follow-up herbicide application will also be applied. **There should not be many non-commercial stems remaining to cut in the Regeneration Areas**. Significant funding will be spent for such invasive plant control work. As such, timeliness of this harvest is important.
- ¹ **There is only one "Conversion Area."** It will become grassland or savanna. This is the SW-most "Aspen Regeneration &/or Conversion Area." This area will not be forestry mowed. However, stems of non-commercial size **do not** need to be cut there. Any suitable firewood **there** may be salvaged, whether standing or down on the ground.
- The objective is to restore most of the sale area to an oak woodland; this is not normal forest management. The plan is to manage this area with prescribed fire moving forward. Wherever possible throughout the entire sale, **slash shall not be left within 10 feet of the bole of residual trees**.
- Some of the best quality timber is in the northwestern portion of this sale, while the worst is on the eastern end.
- There is very good access to this sale from both Tollefson and Hagen Roads. That said, the DNR maintains most of the road west of N3900 Tollefson Road. It is not plowed in the winter.
- A few snags have been marked for harvest; cut those. If desired, approximately 1/2 of the merchantable dead trees on the sale may be cut and utilized as fuelwood. **Half of the total fuelwood volume is reflected above**. The intent is to reduce fuel for future prescribed burns. In the 3-acre Conversion Area, however, all fuelwood may be salvaged.
- There is a population of a nasty invasive that DNR is trying to eradicate between the small white pine plantation to be thinned and the parking lot just W of it. To prevent its spread, absolutely no equipment may be operated in that area.
- Paint lines on the timber sale map signify the color and location of paint lines on the ground. **Do not** cut any trees marking these paint line boundaries, whether they are painted with red or purple paint.
- This sale was cruised by Forestry Technician Hushagen using "Forest Metrics."



Contract and other Sale Requirements:

- **Contract Period:** A 2-year contract beginning on September 1st, 2019, and extending through April 1st annually, with the contract expiring on April 1st, 2021, will be utilized. Aspen will be harvested when dormant.
- Any dead snags should be left standing, unless they pose a safety hazard.
- There is a small stand of cottonwood east of the stream along northwest of the DNR parking lot. DNR would prefer these to be harvested, however they were not included in the timber sale because of lack of markets to sell cottonwood species. It will be the contractor's discretion whether they harvest and utilize this area.
- A small tree planting exists adjacent to the northernmost portion of the sale. **This must be protected.** No equipment will be allowed to travel through this area, nor any wood be landed in this area. Equipment travel must occur within the sale boundary for that area.
- Skid trails will be restricted to the outer edges of planted prairie grasses in the southwest portion of the sale.
- Landing locations throughout the timber sale area are at the contractor's discretion, although they must be approved by the DNR Forester. Any access road use other than that depicted on the timber sale maps must also be approved.
- Paint lines on the timber sale map signify the color and location of paint lines on the ground.




Contract and other Sale Requirements:

- **Contract Period:** The majority of this timber sale must be harvested between **July 16th, 2019, and March 31st, 2020**. The aspen regeneration area that lies in approximately the eastern half of the central portion of this sale shall be harvested between **September 15th, 2018, and March 31st, 2019**. No harvest operations may occur during the traditional 9-day gun deer season.
- **Significant funding has been spent to control invasive plants within the sale area. Timing is critical for successful regeneration.** DNR forestry mowed the western-most portion of this sale (about 5 acres). Throughout the remainder of the sale, all stems of the following species were killed via a basal bark herbicide treatment: buckthorn, boxelder, black locust, etc. **The logging contractor will not be required to cut these dead, treated stems. There should not be many non-commercial stems remaining to cut in any portion of this sale.**
- A verbal agreement granting access to cut and haul wood products on DNR lands in the eastern-most portion of this timber sale was reached with the private landowner who owns the SESE of Sec. 5. **However, that property has since been foreclosed upon.** Markesan State Bank currently owns it; they are in the process of selling it. The DNR Forester has been in communication with the bank in hopes that the future buyer will allow the logging contractor to cross the private "forty" from the DNR property in the NENE of Sec. 8 to the SWSW of Sec. 4. **No such access is guaranteed at this point.** If applicable, the winning bidder would be responsible for working out the terms and developing a written access agreement with the new landowner.
- The other feasible means of accessing this eastern-most portion of the sale would require frozen ground access across a wetland just east of the central portion of the sale. DNR has timber mats that could be utilized for this crossing free of charge, so long as they are returned in like condition. The logging contractor would be responsible for moving them.
- A crop field must be crossed to access the western-most portion of this sale. Such access will only be allowed once the crops have been harvested and removed for the season. Any landing locations or access road use other than that depicted on the timber sale map must be pre-approved by the DNR Forester.
- Any dead snags (i.e. firewood) that will not be cut up and utilized should be left standing, unless they pose a hazard.
- Paint lines on the timber sale map signify the color and location of paint lines on the ground.

- The grade approaching Tomlinson Road from the south on the snowmobile trail was steep for a logging truck. As such, rock fill will be purchased and installed by DNR in order to facilitate access for this timber sale and future ones.
- Note that all boxelder trees of commercial size throughout the sale area will be killed prior to the harvest via a basal bark herbicide application.
- **Note the powerline hazard on the north side of the sale that is depicted on the timber sale map.**
- Any dead snags (i.e. fuelwood) that will not be cut up and utilized should be left standing, unless they pose a hazard.
- Paint lines on the timber sale map signify the colour and location of paint lines on the ground. **Do not** cut any trees marking these paint line boundaries, whether they are painted with red, yellow, purple, or blue paint.
