BIDDING REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Bidding Procedure for Timber Sales
 - a. Bids will be made by <u>species</u> for each tract.
 - b. Estimated volumes and utilization specifications are listed on individual sale prospectus maps. Bid according to volumes listed on individual sale prospectus and/or maps.
 - c. The **high bidder** will be determined by the **greatest total bid** for each tract.
 - d. Bids will be opened in random order.
 - e. **Bidders in attendance (virtual)** can remove their bid from consideration before each individual tract is opened. Bidders must identify themselves by clearly stating their name, address, and telephone number PRIOR to a bid being opened to withdraw their bid from consideration.
- 2. Bids may be made on one or more tracts.
- 3. Submit each bid in an **individual sealed envelope** marked "Bid for Timber Stumpage" with the timber sale name, and tract number on the outside. Wisconsin DNR Timber Sale Bid Forms must be used to make bids on DNR timber sales and is included with the individual sale prospectus.
- 4. A per unit bid must be made on every item on a tract. No "zero-\$0.00" bids for any species or products will be accepted and bid will be rejected.



- 5. Winning bidders will be notified within 24 hours of bid opening and must sign the timber sale contract within 30 days and submit an acceptable performance bond within 6 weeks of the bid opening. If the winning bidder fails to execute the contract and submit an acceptable performance bond, the bidder shall be required to forfeit to the department an amount equal to 10% of the total bid amount. Failure to forfeit the 10% penalty will result in the bidder being considered ineligible to bid on any state or GNA timber sales for a two-year period.
- 6. A <u>Performance Bond or Letter of Credit</u> is required before awarding of contract. The bond shall be fifteen percent (15%) of the total bid value or a minimum of \$1000.00, whichever is greater. The bond will be held intact by the Department of Natural Resources until the satisfactory completion of the timber sale contract. Performance bonds in a form of other than cash for these sales must expire no earlier than **1-year past contract expiration date.**
- 7. For sales requiring pesticide applications (e.g. HRD treatment). The Purchaser shall ensure and provide documentation that any person(s) who applies or handles any pesticide on Department lands is covered by a valid Pesticide Business License, Individual Commercial Applicators License, and Forestry 2.0 Certification issued by the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) prior to pesticide application.

 The cost of this application can vary based on application method and harvest conditions, but should be considered when submitting bids on these timber sales.
- 8. The Department of Natural Resources reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

SALES TAX CERTIFICATION

1. A <u>Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate</u> must be provided at the signing of the contract. This certificate is required to cover a contractor or individual reselling stumpage harvested for firewood/fuelwood and mills and manufacturing facilities. UTILIZATION

1. All trees designated for cutting will be utilized to a 4" top unless stated otherwise in the prospectus.

SCALING AND PAYMENT

- 1. If eligible for deferred payment option, payment for timber removed from site must be made within 30 days after invoice.
- 2. If not eligible for deferred payment option, no wood will be hauled from the sale area until advanced payment is made.
- 3. If sold as a lump sum sale, payment in full must be made on entire sale, or by the cutting block, or by some other means as mutually agreed upon by Department of Natural Resources and contractor.
- 4. The mill scale ticket system will be used as the preferred method of sale administration. Other scaling systems may be used at the discretion of the Department of Natural Resources.
- 5. No refunds of stumpage payments will be made for un-removed wood, and wood left on the sale area at contract expiration shall revert to the seller.
- 6. Scribner Decimal C Log Rule shall be used for scaling logs. Conversion from MBF to cords or cords to MBF shall be 2.44 cords per MBF for softwoods and 2.2 cords per MBF for hardwoods.
- 7. Weight scale conversions will be at rates as specified in the Department of Natural Resources timber sale handbook listed below, unless the individual timber sale has specific mixed species prorates/conversions.

CONTRACT PERIOD

1. All contracts offered during this bid opening will expire on June 30th, 2028.

CONTRACT EXTENSIONS

Contract extensions will not be granted without justifiable reason. Justification will be determined by the Department of Natural Resources. Contract expiration dates are given on the individual timber sale. Contract extensions are not guaranteed. All extensions, if granted, will be for 1 year. Extension requests will be considered with the following conditions:

One and Two-year contracts

- 1st extension 5% increase in stumpage rate
- 2nd extension an additional 10% increase in stumpage rate

Three and Four-year Contracts

• 1st extension – 15% increase in stumpage rate (only 1 extension granted)

OTHER CONDITIONS

Emerald Ash Borer is widespread on the property with significant ash mortality. Contractor should bid accordingly

- 1. If any products are hauled to the purchaser's or sub-contractor's businesses, then State Forester reserves the right to scale all products on-site before they can leave the property and payment is due 30 days from billing. If being scaled on-site, log piles must be less than 6' in height with small end facing out and piled with logs of the same length or have the log lengths marked on the small end. Maximum of one on-site scale per week unless otherwise agreed upon with the forester.
- 2. Contractor must complete a walk through with state forester prior to beginning sale. Advanced notice (>2 weeks) is expected to schedule walk through prior to sale activity occurring.
- 3. Because of threats from invasive plant species, logging equipment coming onto each individual timber sale on state lands must be washed free of debris to prevent transfer of seeds. Any simple washing (power wash) is acceptable. Inspection of equipment will be done when logging equipment arrives on-site before logging operations begin. Timber mats must also be free of debris when arriving on-site.
- 4. Timber mats may be needed on ditch crossings.
- 5. Fuel refill and equipment maintenance must occur in an area approved by property manager or forester. Fuel and oil cans must be capped when not in use. Preventing fuel spills is very important in these wetland sites.
- 6. All best management practices apply including rutting standards. Prior approval is necessary for location of roads and landings.
- 7. No skidding or forwarding of logs longer than 16 feet plus trim without prior approval of DNR Forester administering the sale.
- 8. No timber sale activity allowed during the 9-day gun deer season.
- 9. Landing areas must be preapproved by the property manager or DNR forester. Landing areas must remain level and free of debris. No decked wood may remain on property after ground begins to thaw in the spring.
