BIDDING REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Bidding Procedure for Timber Sales
- a. Bids will be made by species for each tract.
 - b. Estimated volumes and utilization specifications are listed on individual sale prospectus maps. Bid according to volumes listed on individual sale prospectus and/or maps.
 - c. The **high bidder** will be determined by the **greatest total bid** for each tract.
- d. Bids will be opened in random order.
- e. **Bidders in attendance (virtual)** can remove their bid from consideration before each individual tract is opened. Bidders must identify themselves by clearly stating their name, address, and telephone number PRIOR to a bid being opened to withdraw their bid from consideration.
 - 2. Bids may be made on one or more tracts.
 - 3. Submit each bid in an **individual sealed envelope** marked "Bid for Timber Stumpage" with the timber sale name, and tract number on the outside. Wisconsin DNR Timber Sale Bid Forms must be used to make bids on DNR timber sales and is included with the individual sale prospectus.
 - 4. A per unit bid must be made on every item on a tract. No "zero-\$0.00" bids for any species or products will be accepted and bid will be rejected.
 - 5. Winning bidders will be notified within 24 hours of bid opening and must sign the timber sale contract and submit an acceptable performance bond within 6 weeks of the bid opening. If the winning bidder fails to execute the contract and submit an acceptable performance bond, the bidder shall be required to forfeit to the department an amount equal to 10% of the total bid amount. Failure to forfeit the 10% penalty will result in the bidder being considered ineligible to bid on any state or GNA timber sales for a two-year period.
 - 6. A <u>Performance Bond or Letter of Credit</u> is required before awarding of contract. The bond shall be fifteen percent (15%) of the total bid value or a minimum of \$1000.00, whichever is greater. The bond will be held intact by the Department of Natural Resources until the satisfactory completion of the timber sale contract. Contents of an irrevocable letter of credit (LOC) or Assurance/Surety bonds must include the following:
 - a. Letter of Credit number.
 - b. Timber sale identification property name and sale or tract number.
 - c. A clear statement that it is irrevocable.
 - d. Name of the bank's customer; that is the principal.
 - e. Amount of credit extended (maximum limit). This limit must equal or exceed the penal sum or penalty for which the letter of credit is pledged to secure.
 - f. An authorization to draw sight drafts upon the bank in favor of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.
 - g. A clear statement that the letter of credit number appearing on a sight draft is sufficient identification for honoring it. The letter must specify only one identification number.
 - h. Expiration of bond: The expiration date must be 1 year beyond the contract expiration date.
 - 7. For sales requiring pesticide applications (e.g. HRD treatment). The Purchaser shall ensure and provide documentation that any person(s) who applies or handles any pesticide on Department lands is covered by a valid Pesticide Business License, Individual Commercial Applicators License, and Forestry 2.0 Certification issued by the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) prior to pesticide application. The cost of this application can vary based on application method and harvest conditions, but should be considered when submitting bids on these timber sales.
 - 8. The Department of Natural Resources reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

SALES TAX CERTIFICATION

1. A <u>Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate</u> must be provided at the signing of the contract. This certificate is required to cover a contractor or individual reselling stumpage harvested for firewood/fuelwood and mills and manufacturing facilities. UTILIZATION

- 1. All trees designated for cutting will be utilized to a 6" top unless stated otherwise in the prospectus.
- 2. See individual timber sales for utilization specifications.

SCALING AND PAYMENT

- 1. If eligible for deferred payment option, payment for timber removed from site must be made within 30 days after invoice.
- 2. If not eligible for deferred payment option, no wood will be hauled from the sale area until advanced payment is made.
- 3. If sold as a lump sum sale, payment in full must be made on entire sale, or by the cutting block, or by some other means as mutually agreed upon by Department of Natural Resources and contractor.
- 4. The mill scale ticket system will be used as the preferred method of sale administration. Other scaling systems may be used at the discretion of the Department of Natural Resources.
- 5. If a woods scale system is used, all cordwood or logs will be piled for scaling. Piles will be level and square with at least 10 cords per pile. At least 10 cords will be piled before a scale is requested. Scaling requests must be made at least one day in advance.
- 6. No refunds of stumpage payments will be made for un-removed wood, and wood left on the sale area at contract expiration shall revert to the seller.
- 7. Scribner Decimal C Log Rule shall be used for scaling logs. Conversion from MBF to cords or cords to MBF shall be 2.44 cords per MBF for softwoods and 2.2 cords per MBF for hardwoods.
- 8. Weight scale conversions will be at rates as specified in the Department of Natural Resources timber sale handbook listed below, unless the individual timber sale has specific mixed species prorates/conversions.


TRAINING STANDARD

<u>Unit 1-</u> (23 Acres) Within the sale area cut all oak, aspen, birch, red maple, and white pine greater than 1-inch DBH. Do NOT cut any white oak, white spruce, or any trees marked with red paint. All standing dead trees within a 100-foot distance of any access road or trail shall be cut. The standard utilization is 6" minimum top diameter for all species.



- Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) and Invasive Species Inspections
 - 1. All equipment, trucks and specifically off-road logging equipment shall be free of plant material and soil, prior to entering the property. The Purchaser will contact the seller 48-hours prior to delivering equipment to the property to arrange for on-site inspection.
 - a. Off road logging equipment must be inspected upon arrival to the property. Inspection by Forester or Wildlife staff must occur prior to each entry into the property (example: if you move logging equipment from the property to a different job off site for a week, prior to re-entering the property with that logging equipment, it must be re-inspected).
 - b. After initial inspection, it is the responsibility of the Purchaser to ensure pickup trucks and logging trucks are clean and free of plant/soil materials upon each entry.
 - 2. To avoid spreading CWD prions and invasive plant materials, all equipment must be cleaned prior to entering and leaving the property.
- Follow WI BMP's for water quality at all times. Avoid wetlands as much as possible and only operate within them during very dry times with timber matting or under frozen ground conditions. Some areas of this sale will likely require frozen ground conditions due to access across wetlands.

 - 1. Off-road logging equipment shall be free of concentrations of plant material and soil prior to entering the sale area. The Purchaser will contact the Seller 48 hours prior to delivering equipment to the sale area to arrange for on-site inspection.


- 2. To avoid spreading invasive plant materials, all equipment must be cleaned prior to entering and leaving the sale area.
- Follow WI BMP's for water quality at all times. Avoid wetlands as much as possible and only operate within them during very dry times with timber matting or under frozen ground conditions. Some areas of this sale will likely require frozen ground conditions due to access across wetlands.
- Lump sum sale, payment in full must be made on entire sale, or by agreed upon cutting blocks, or by some other means as mutually agreed upon by Department of Natural Resources and contractor.
- Check the contract for other requirements.


