Other species not mentioned will be charged at the mixed pulp price.

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The performance bond will be 15% of the total sale value. **The contract end date is June 30, 2029**

**SPECIAL SALE CONDITIONS:**

Equipment use will be allowed during very dry or frozen ground conditions due to wet soil conditions.

Equipment operations can only take place between September 19<sup>th</sup> and April 30<sup>th</sup>.

Access can either be from the north woods trail or from Myers Farm Road. If accessing from Myers Farm Rd, a temporary in-stream crossing using timber mats will be required. All conditions of the temporary in-stream crossing, which will be obtained by the Flambeau River State Forest, will be followed by the contractor. The mats must be placed during very dry or frozen conditions and removed prior to spring thaw.

Erosion control materials will need to be placed by a contractor at locations indicated on map.

If decking on State Forest roads, all slash ends, and debris must be removed from the roads and ditches concurrently with each truckload.

No decking or landings within 100' of the stream.

Town of Winter does not allow decking on west lane.

Debris berms, if removed, are required at existing locations on map.
