

-  White Birch Harvest Area (12 acres) Cut same as above.
-  Pine Thinning Area (84 Acres): Cut all trees marked with orange paint and merchantable balsam fir.
-  GTR (26 acres) Green Tree Retention

15% of the total sale bid value will be required for performance bond.

The cutting area is approximately 211 acres with 26 acres of Green Tree Retention (GTR).

The contract period is 3 years.

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to a 4” top diameter will be cut and utilized.

Whole tree harvest is not allowed due to restricted soils.

² Volume includes 50% red maple, 50% white birch (Mx. Hardwood Wt. Avg. 2.338 tons/cord)

Calculated Volumes do not include GTR acres.

The total sale volume equates to approximately 31 tons/acre.

Special Conditions

1. Logging operations must occur during dry or frozen ground conditions. Cutting must be concurrent for all species to be harvested.
2. No slash allowed across any red line or within any wetland. Slash must be lopped and scattered to lay within 2 feet of the ground and pulled back into the sale area at least 10 feet away from all woods roads.
3. No equipment will be allowed to operate within 15 ft. of any wetland or water body.
4. All standing dead snags must remain standing unless they pose a hazard to operator safety.
5. All landings and any new woods roads must be approved prior to sale start up.
6. All pine products cut between May 1st and September 1st must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from the time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed prior to May 1st of each year.
