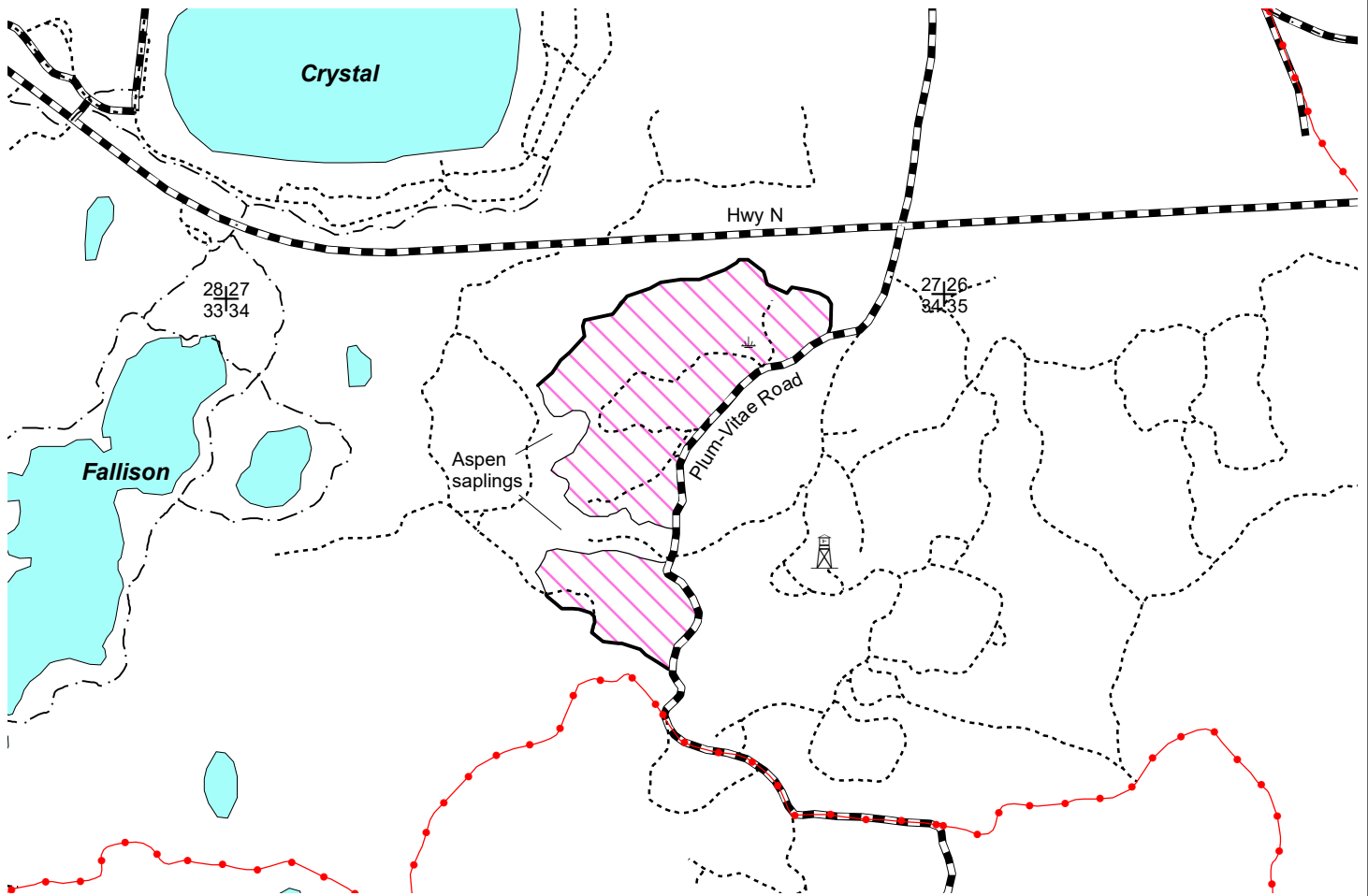






 Oak Harvest Area (64 Acres): Cut all maple, oak, and pine not marked green. Cut all ironwood over 2" diameter.
Keep area around residual trees clear of slash.
Pull back slash 10 feet from base of trees.

***Note: No harvesting or skidding April 15 - July 15
due to the risk of Oak Wilt.***

Section 27 – SWSE, SESE

Section 34 – NENE, NWNE, SWNE, NENW, SENW, NWSE

No bid bond is required.

15% of the total sale bid value will be required for performance bond.

The cutting area is approximately 64 acres.

The contract period is 3 years.

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to the minimum top diameter will be cut and utilized.

Whole Tree harvest is not allowed.

Note: Total sale volume equates to 61.6 tons/acre or 24.8 cords/acre.

Special Conditions

1. Slash adjacent to Plum-Vitae Road must be lopped and/or scattered to lie within two feet of the ground. Pull back at least ten feet behind tree line.
2. **Slash shall be pulled back ten feet from reserve trees.** The intent is to protect residual trees from heat/damage during future prescribed fire operations.
3. Cutting must be concurrent for all species to be harvested.
4. No harvesting or skidding allowed April 15 – July 15 due to risk of oak wilt.
5. No equipment allowed within 15 feet of ephemeral ponds.
6. Do not knock down or utilize any dead trees.
