


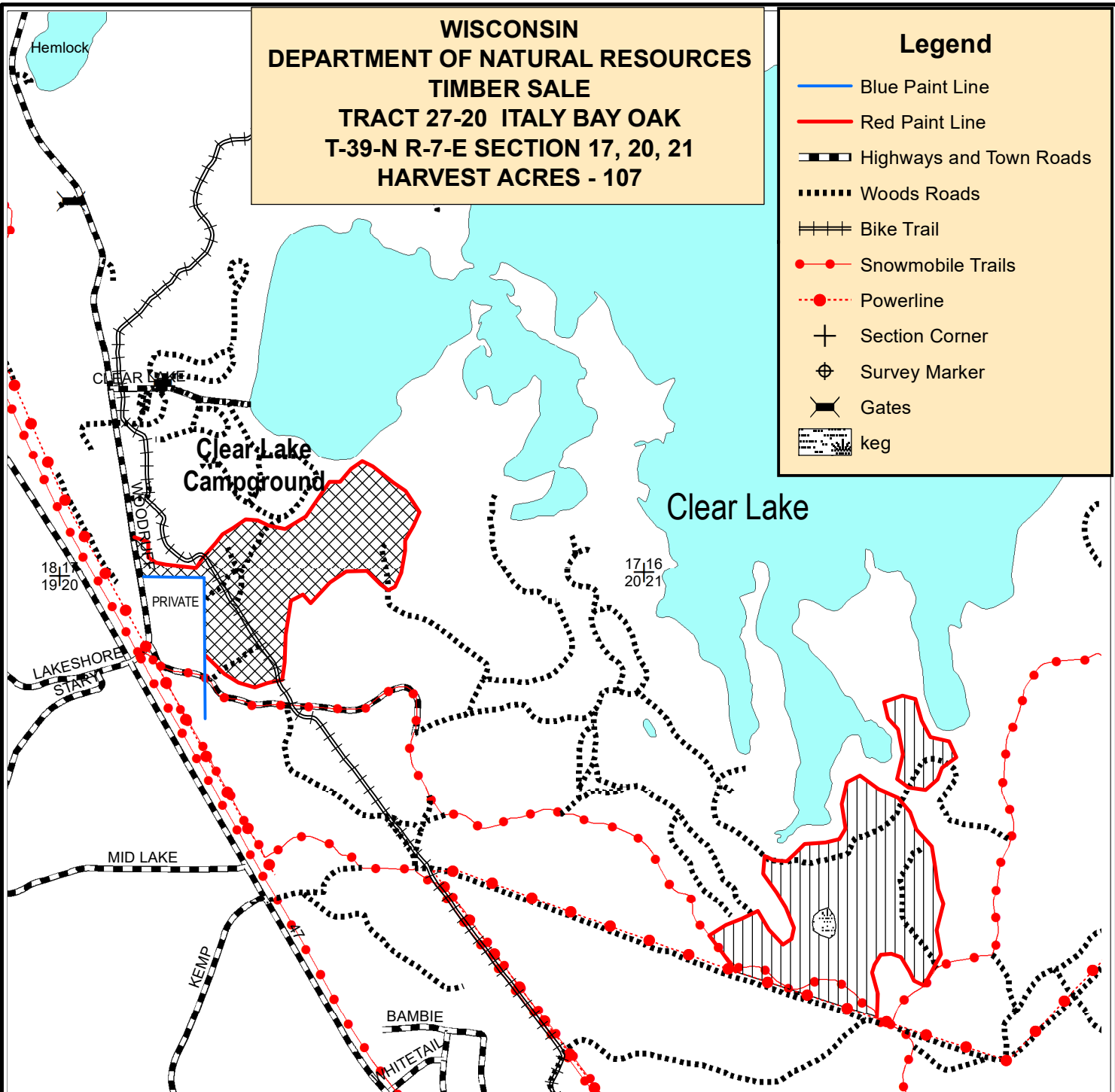

Shelterwood Area (45 Acres): Cut all merchantable maple, oak, fir, ironwood and trees marked with orange paint. Do not harvest any trees marked with green paint in this area.



Overstory Removal Area (60 Acres): Cut all merchantable maple, oak, basswood, aspen, fir, and pine NOT marked with purple paint.

Oak Wilt Restriction: No Harvesting / skidding allowed April 15 -July 15 (entire sale area)

No harvesting / skidding in the Shelterwood Area from July 15 - September 15 due to seasonal recreational considerations

No bid bond required.

15% of the total sale bid value will be required for performance bond.

The cutting area is approximately 107 acres.

The contract period is 3 years.

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to a minimum top diameter of 4" will be cut and utilized.

Whole tree harvest is not allowed.

¹ Volume includes Approximately 240 MBF red oak saw log potential.

² Volume includes 63% hard maple, 30% red maple, 7% misc. (Wt. conv. 2.589)

³ Volume includes approximately 21 MBF hard maple, 3 MBF red maple and 1 MBF basswood saw log potential.

⁴ Volume includes 75% red pine, 18% white pine, and 7% balsam fir. (Wt. conv. 2.212)

⁵ Volume includes approximately 47 MBF red pine, and 10 MBF white pine saw log potential.

Special Conditions

1. No Logging Activity allowed from April 15th – July 15th due to the risk of Oak Wilt. In Stand 1 (oak shelterwood) no logging activity allowed from July 15th – September 15th due to seasonal recreation considerations.
2. Do not cut any trees within 15 feet of any ephemeral pond. Cutting must be concurrent for all species to be harvested.
3. All slash must be pulled back at least ten feet away from snowmobile trails, paved bike trails, and roads.
4. No slash allowed across any blue line, red line, powerline, or within any wetland. Slash must be lopped and scattered to lay within 2 feet of the ground and pulled back into the sale area at least 10 feet away from the adjacent private lands and public roads.
5. All landings and any new woods roads must be approved prior to sale start up.
6. All pine products cut between May 1st and September 1st must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from the time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed prior to May 1st of each year.
7. If the contract is to be worked on during multiple time periods a mid-contract "pull-off" inspection meeting will be required. One-week notice shall be given by the contractor prior to moving equipment off site. During the "pull-off" inspection, provisions needing attention will be documented. The contractor at that time can decide to remedy them before pulling equipment off or rectify them when moving back onto the site. If the latter is chosen, documented items shall be addressed before harvesting can continue.
8. The designated snowmobile trail will be signed and kept in rideable condition if the sale becomes active during the snowmobile season. Extra care will be taken to protect the paved bike trail from damage. The logger will be responsible for placing appropriate signage.
