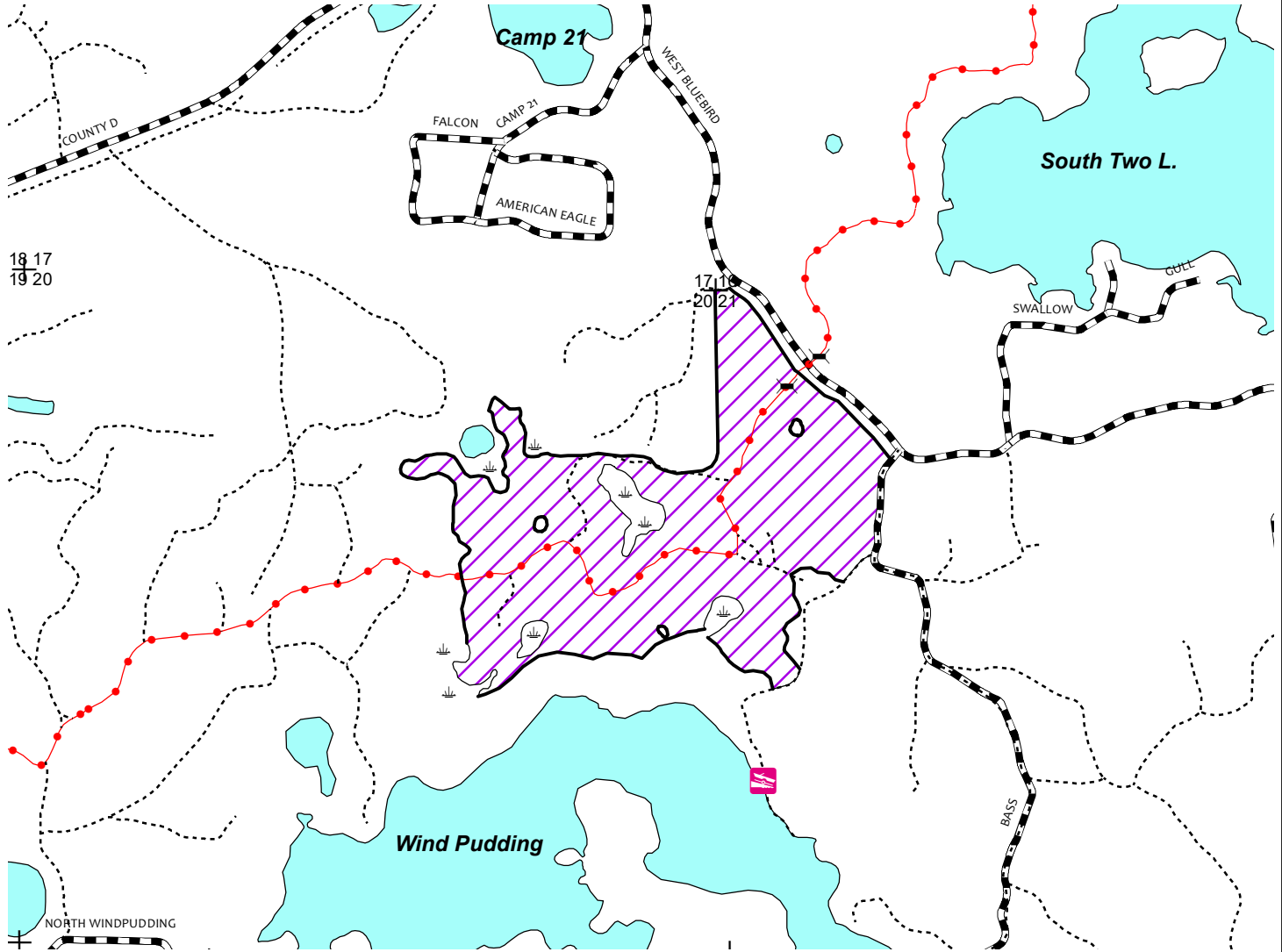

Aspen Area (125 acres): Cut all merchantable aspen, maple and white birch EXCEPT those marked with green paint. Sever at the stump or pull out all 1 to 5 inch maple. Do NOT cut any oak, pine or balsam fir.

All stands are within Mgmt. Area 6:  
Oneida Sandy Plains -  
Forest Production

**Note: No cutting/skidding or road work from  
April 15 to July 15 due to the risk of oak wilt.**

Oneida County

Town 38 North, Range 7 East

Section 20 – Gov Lot 1 & 2, NWNE, SWNE, SENE

Section 21 – Gov Lot 4, NWNW, SWNW

No bid bond required.

15% of the total sale bid value will be required for performance bond.

The cutting area is approximately 125 acres.

The contract period is 3 years.

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to the minimum 4” top diameter will be cut and utilized.

Whole tree utilization is not allowed.

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<sup>1</sup> Approximately 76% Red Maple, 17% White Birch and 7% Sugar Maple. Included within this volume is approximately 36 MBF of Maple saw-log sized material. Weight conversion – 2.313 tons/cord.

The total sale volume equates to approximately 64 tons/acre or 27 cords/acre.

1. Cutting must be concurrent for all species to be harvested.
2. Biomass Harvesting is not allowed.
3. No sale activity, except trucking, allowed between April 15<sup>th</sup> and July 15<sup>th</sup>.
4. Trees may not be felled into wetland/swamp areas.
5. Slash adjacent to Town Roads and the snowmobile trail must be lopped and/or scattered to lie within two feet of the ground and pulled back at least 10 feet behind the tree line concurrently with cutting.
6. Decking will be permitted along the snowmobile trails, as indicated on the map, in select areas. Trails must be free of debris, always have snow cover and remain open to vehicle traffic. All trails must be repaired to pre-harvest conditions before the start of each snow season.
