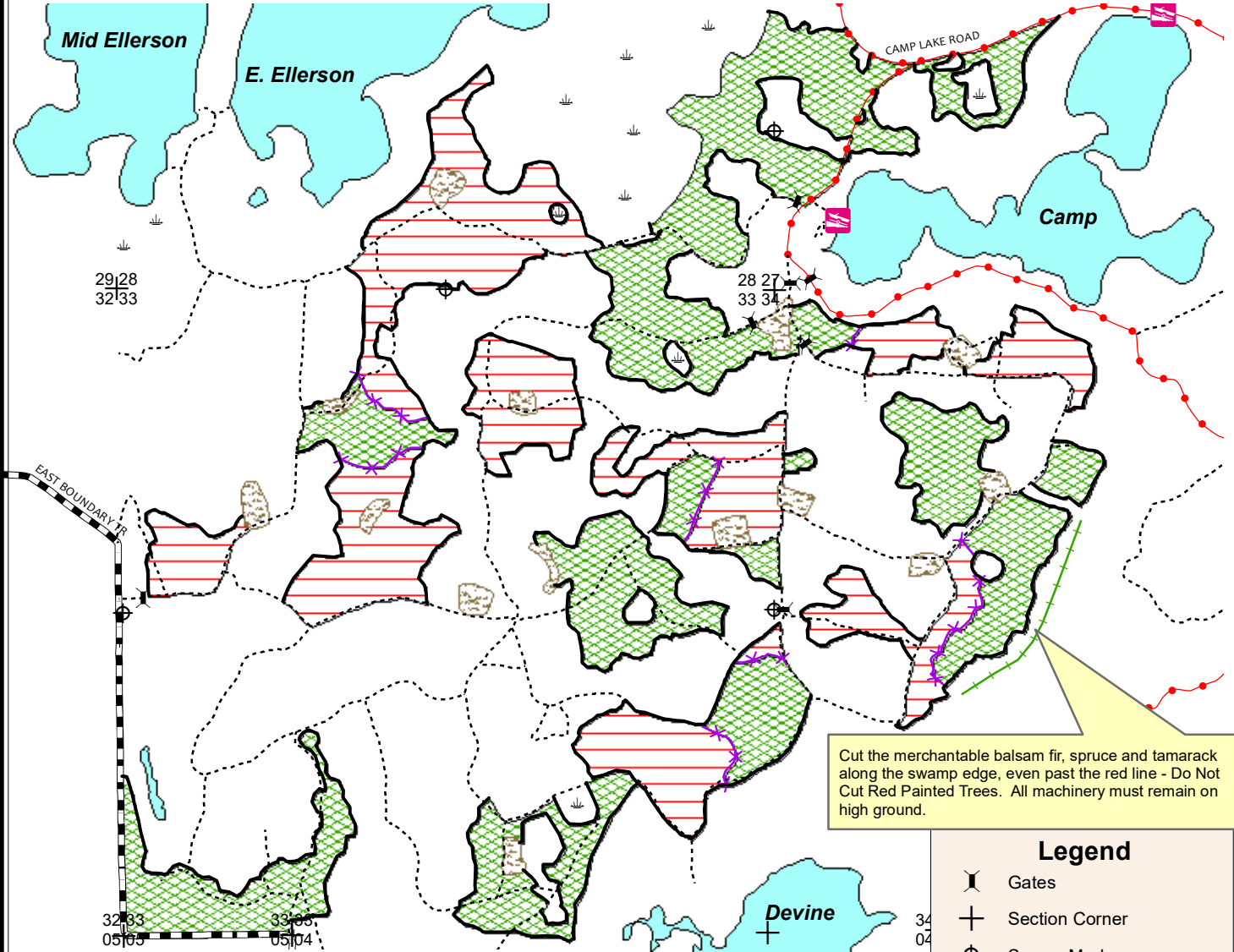





Cut the merchantable balsam fir, spruce and tamarack along the swamp edge, even past the red line - Do Not Cut Red Painted Trees. All machinery must remain on high ground.

 Aspen Harvest Area (208 Acres): Cut all merchantable aspen, maple and balsam fir. Cut white birch greater than 10" in diameter. Cut orange marked red oak and pine. Cut all 1 to 5 inch maple.

 Aspen/Oak Harvest Area (154 Acres): Cut same as above EXCEPT do NOT cut 1 to 5 inch maple.





No decking of wood allowed between Camp Lake Road and the boat landing. SEASONAL RESTRICTION - No road work or cutting/skidding in the Aspen/Oak Cutting Areas from April 15 to July 15 due to the risk of oak wilt.**

The cutting area is approximately 362 acres.

The contract period is 3 years. **\*\*NOTE: If this sale is granted an extension, the stumpage price will be increased by 15%\*\***

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to the minimum 4" top diameter will be cut and utilized.

Whole tree harvest IS NOT allowed on this timber sale.

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1\ Balsam Fir – Approximately 236 tons Balsam Fir, 86 tons Tamarack, 24 tons Spruce, 19 tons Red Pine and 5 tons White Pine.  
Weighted average = 2.165 tons/cord.

2\ Red Oak – Contains approximately 74 MBF Red Oak Sawlog material.

3\ Mixed Hardwood – Approximately 482 tons Red Maple, 186 tons White Birch (includes 17 MBF White Birch) and 17 tons Sugar Maple (includes 0.5 MBF Sugar Maple). Weighted average = 2.325 tons/cord.

4\ Red Pine – Contains approximately 4 MBF White Pine.

Sale contains approximately 57.7 tons/acre or 25.1 cords/acre.

Special Conditions

1. **SEASONAL RESTRICTION:** No road work or cutting/skidding in the Aspen/Oak Cutting Area from April 15 to July 15 due to the risk of oak wilt.
2. Do not cut white birch less than 10" in DBH.
3. The road to the Camp Lake Boat Landing must remain open and drivable to the public at all times. No decking of wood allowed between Camp Lake Road and the boat landing.
4. All landings and any new roads must be approved prior to sale start up. All roads must be cleared of debris and leveled upon sale completion.
5. Slash adjacent to the snowmobile trail must be lopped and scattered within 2 feet of the ground and pulled back into the sale area at least 10 feet from the trail.
6. Do not operate machinery within 15 feet of any ephemeral pond or wetland.
7. All pine products cut between May 1 and September 1 each year must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed prior to May 1 of each year
