

Red Pine Area (5 acres): Cut all orange marked trees.

Northern Hardwood Area (56 acres): Cut all aspen, balsam fir, and orange marked trees.

Do not cut any green marked trees.

Note: Seasonal Restriction - No Harvest activity allowed between April 15 and July 15 in order to prevent establishment of oak wilt.

Harvest is only allowed under dry or frozen ground conditions.

No bid bond required.

15% of the total sale bid value or \$1,000.00, whichever is greater, will be required for performance bond.

The sale area is approximately 149 acres.

The cutting area is approximately 126 acres.

The contract period is 3 years.

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to a minimum top diameter of 4" will be cut and utilized.

Whole tree harvest is allowed.

## Special Conditions

- 1. All pine products cut between May 1 and September 1 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed prior to May 1 of each year.
- 2. If harvesting occurs while the snowmobile trail is open, signs must be placed on both ends of the harvest area to notify users of the active timber harvest. Snowmobile trail must be kept snow covered and clear of debris if harvesting while trail is open.
- 3. Do not cut any trees within 15 feet of any ephemeral pond. All other areas are to be operated in during dry or frozen ground conditions to prevent soil damage and rutting. Cutting must be concurrent for all species to be harvested.
- 4. Do not cut any snags unless they pose a safety hazard.
- 5. No slash allowed across any blue line, red line, powerline, or within any wetland. Slash must be lopped and scattered to lay within 2 feet of the ground and pulled back into the sale area at least 10 feet away from the adjacent private lands, snowmobile trails, and public roads.
- 6. All landings and any new woods roads must be approved prior to sale start up.
- 7. If the contract is to be worked on during multiple time periods, a mid-contract "pull-off" inspection meeting will be required. One-week notice shall be given by the contractor prior to moving equipment off site. During the "pull-off" inspection, provisions needing attention will be documented. The contractor at that time can decide to remedy them before pulling equipment off or rectify them when moving back onto the site. If the latter is chosen, documented items shall be addressed before harvesting can continue.
- 8. No overnight camping will be allowed on the property except in designated camping locations between September 1<sup>st</sup> and December 31<sup>st</sup>.
