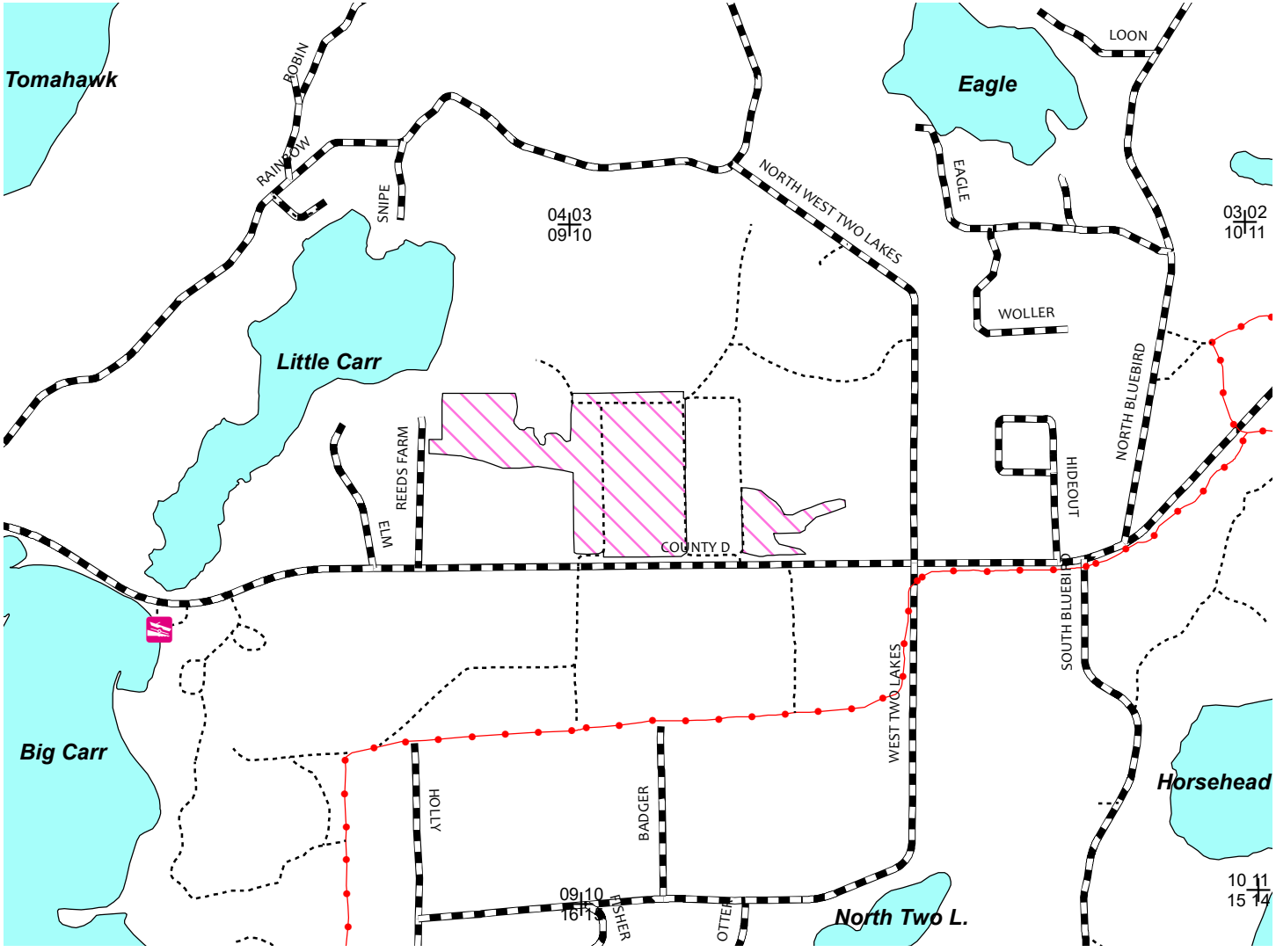

The cutting area is approximately 41 acres.

The contract period is from **contract signing to July 1, 2024.**

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to the minimum 4” top diameter will be cut and utilized.

Whole tree utilization is not allowed.

<sup>1</sup> Approximately 94% Red Pine and 6% White Pine. Included within this volume is approximately 51 MBF of Red Pine and 2 MBF of White Pine saw-log sized material. Weight conversion – 2.24 tons/cord.

The total sale volume equates to approximately 24 tons/acre or 11 cords/acre.

1. Maintain all snags and den trees unless they pose a safety concern.
2. Biomass Harvesting is not allowed.
3. Slash within 50 feet of County Highway D must be lopped and/or scattered to lie within two feet of the ground and pulled back at least 10 feet behind the tree line concurrently with cutting.
4. No sale activity allowed between May 10 and September 30.
