

## NH-ALSF TRACT NO. 6-21 MUDDY BIRD

## Oneida County

Township 38 North Range 7 East

Section 6 – S1/2S1/2 Section 7 – NENW, SENW, NE1/4, E1/2SE1/4 Section 8 – NWNW, NWSW, Gov Lot 5, Gov Lot 6, Gov Lot 7

15% of the total sale bid value or \$1,000.00, whichever is greater, will be required for performance bond. The cutting area is approximately <u>284</u> acres.

The contract period is from contract signing to July 1 2024

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to a 4" top diameter will be cut and utilized. Whole tree harvest is not allowed.

The total sale volume equates to approximately 52 tons/acre or 23 cords/acre.

## Special Conditions

Logging operations must occur during dry or frozen ground conditions. Cutting must be concurrent for all species to be harvested.

No slash allowed across any blue line, red line or within any wetland. Slash must be lopped and scattered to lay within 2 feet of the ground and pulled back into the sale area at least 10 feet from adjacent private lands or town roads.

All standing dead snags must remain standing unless they pose a hazard to operator safety.

All landings and any new woods roads must be approved prior to sale start up.

If the contract is to be worked on during multiple time periods a mid-contract "pull-off" inspection meeting will be required. Oneweek notice shall be given by the contractor prior to moving equipment off site. During the "pull-off" inspection, provisions needing attention will be documented. The contractor at that time can decide to remedy them before pulling equipment off or rectify them when moving back onto the site. If the latter is chosen, documented items shall be addressed before harvesting can continue.

**Operational (Oak Wilt) Restriction**: No Harvesting or skidding allowed April 15 – July 15 (entire sale area).
