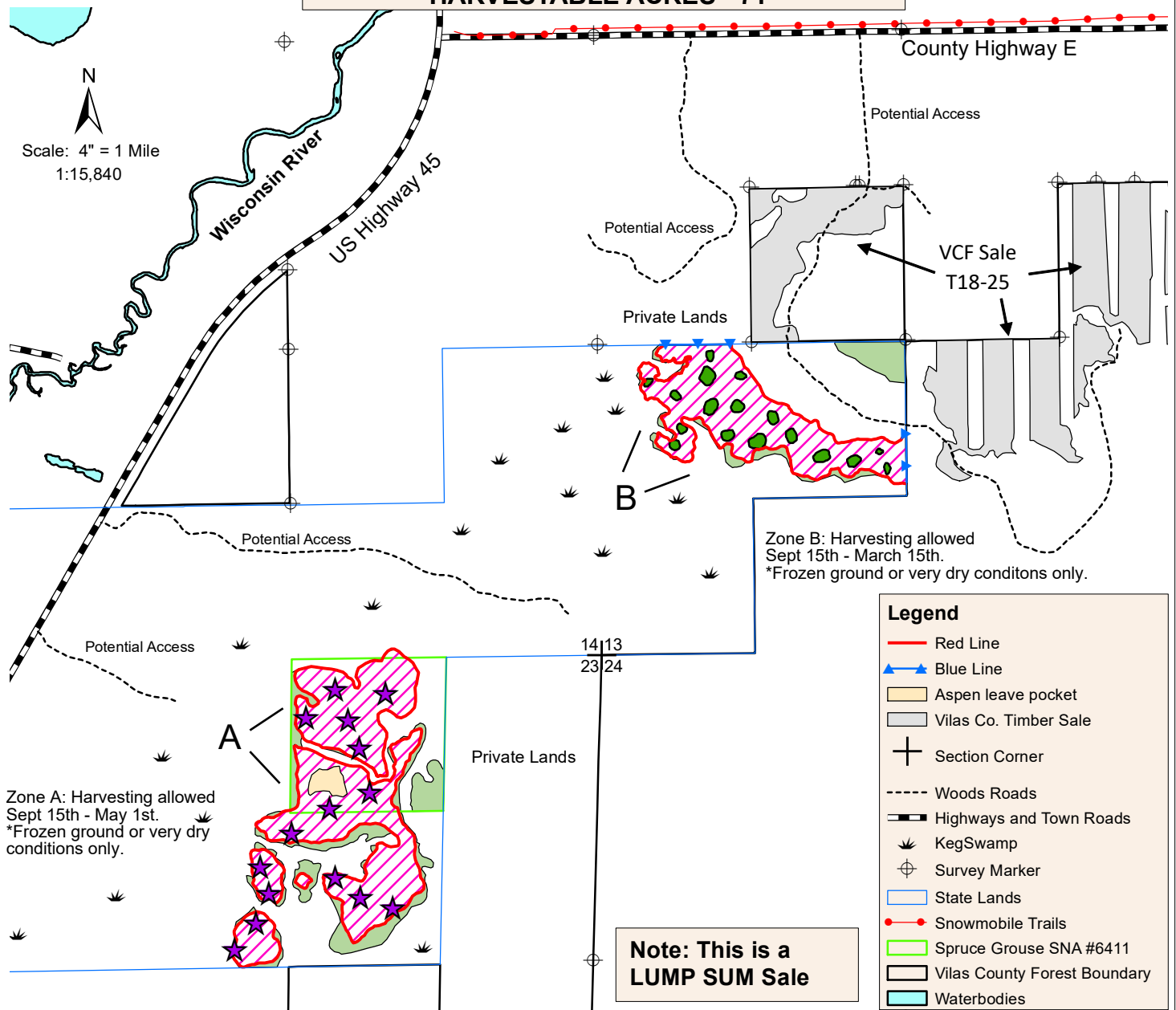

Jack Pine/Spruce Regeneration Harvest (71 Acres): Cut all stems greater than 2" DBH within red paint line EXCEPT aspen and red pine.

Purple Reserve Patches: DO NOT CUT purple marked trees.

Green Reserve Tree Areas: DO NOT CUT pockets of trees designated with green paint or trees w/ green paint.

Green Tree Retention (18 acres) : Do not operate equipment within these areas.

Spruce Grouse Swamp

The total sale area is 89 acres and total cutting area is approximately 71 acres.

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to a 4" top diameter will be cut and utilized.

Total sale volume equates to 47 tons/acre or 22 cords/acre.

Special Conditions:

1. LUMP SUM SALE: One-half of the total lump sum bid value must be paid prior to starting. The remaining balance must be paid once ½ of the acreage is harvested. All trees are to be pre-approved prior to cutting if not marked or designated to be cut. Any residual trees cut, pushed over or damaged are to be decked, scaled, and billed for in addition to lump sum bid value. Any trees cut without approval will subject the contractor to penalties and fines.
2. Zone A – Harvesting activities must be conducted between September 15th and May 1st.
3. Zone B - Harvesting activities must be conducted between September 15th and March 15th.
4. Harvesting during the times for each zone must be under frozen-ground or very dry conditions and operator must utilize top-wood as travel mats while harvesting and forwarding to prevent rutting and soil compaction.
5. All stems greater than 2" DBH must be harvested except aspen and red pine. Purple marked trees, green marked trees, and all stems within the green marked pockets are NOT to be cut. Cutting must be concurrent for all species to be harvested. Biomass harvesting is NOT allowed on this sale.
6. Special care must be taken to avoid damaging pockets of advanced regeneration within the sale.
7. All dead snags are to be left uncut unless they pose a hazard to the harvesting operation.
8. All slash must be lopped to within two feet of the ground and pulled back at least ten feet from the blue line concurrently with cutting. Trees felled across the blue line or into open wetland or keg areas must be pulled back into the sale area before being limbed and topped.
9. Access to the sale will be from US Highway 45 using an existing woods road and County Highway E using an existing woods road that crosses private and Vilas County Forest lands. Roads, trails, and landings must be cleared of debris and leveled upon completion of forest operations. All roadwork and wetland crossings will be the responsibility of the contractor and will be administered and monitored by a State Forester.
10. Wetland skid trails need to protect soil disturbance by utilizing one or more combination of techniques including: frozen ground, slash, corduroy, and timber mats. Different techniques will be suitable for different areas of the sale depending if the wetlands are forested or non-forested wetland types and depending on soil saturation and water movement. Non-merchantable slash is acceptable to leave in areas of wetland harvest as long as it does not impede water movement. Timber mats and corduroy must be removed from wetland areas if they are utilized.
