
Willow Flowage Scenic Waters Area Compartment 8 Stands 1, 5, 9, 13, 14

Stand 9 (25 acres) - is 1928 origin red pine that was last thinned in 2015. It will be thinned again to improve stand quality, health & vigor. The small Scenic Mgmt Area portion will also be thinned.

Stand 13 (32 acres) - is 1894 origin black ash with small amounts of balsam fir, cedar, and a few other wetland tree species. Most black ash will be salvaged due to emerald ash borer recently being found here. Some ash will be retained for wildlife habitat. No other tree species will be cut to encourage conversion to other wetland timber types.

Stand 14 (4 acres) - is 1908 origin hemlock mixed with hardwoods and cedar. It will be thinned to improve stand health along with a few gaps in opportune areas to encourage hemlock and cedar regeneration. The diversity of species within the stand will be maintained.

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
