Background

- Subcommittee focused on revisions to current guidance
- Guidance for reducing or terminating groundwater monitoring at solid waste landfills has been in place for many years
- Existing guidance PUB WA 1013 was last revised in 2014 by Joe Lourigan

Subcommittee Suggestions for Guidance Revision

- Lay out a clear set of steps within the guidance so closed landfill owners can follow a path to reducing or terminating groundwater monitoring
- Include an evaluation so owners can decide if their landfill is ready to be considered for a monitoring reduction or termination
- In addition to the data trends, consider that some landfills may present more risk than others – more receptors
- Create a road to reduction or termination and confirm within the guidance what is required at each step to get there

Subcommittee Suggestions for Guidance Revision (Continued)

- Create a road map within the guidance for:
 - 1. Reducing frequency of monitoring rounds
 - Reducing the size of the monitoring network and/or reducing the number of required parameters
 - 3. Termination of monitoring

Subcommittee Suggestions for Guidance Revision (Continued)

- The steps can also provide incentive to take action toward reduction/termination of monitoring – reduction of annual costs
- Consider reducing monitoring frequency beyond current minimum of 1 year for landfills that qualify (i.e. 2 year or 5 year frequency)
- 2 year or 5 year monitoring frequencies would likely require an annual monitoring well inspection report to maintain competency of monitoring network

Subcommittee Suggestions for Guidance Revision (Continued)

- Potential to set up review committees within DNR to review requests for monitoring reductions/termination
- Review committees improve consistency of decisions and allow a sharing of knowledge
- Potential to use the ICE system to notify landfill owners when reporting is due
