
#### **ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT ACCOUNT--FY 2017 Spending Authority by Agency**


# **Nonpoint Account FY 2015 Revenues**

(TOTAL: \$31.0 million)




#### NONPOINT ACCOUNT FY 2017 Spending Authority by Agency








#### Out-of-State Landfill Tonnage 1990-2015
