10:45 Lynn	Policy Bank/Tracking Plans	 GW Monitoring guidance ready to be posted – new language related to emerging contaminants added recently; questions from Group members on this related to this being a stopping block for ending monitoring PFAS: Recruiting for a Communications position and 2 researchers soon, also a coordinator position across programs within DNR State coordinating committee Technical Advisory Group meeting 12/13 Noted that SWANA group trying to combine with waste water folks and then work with DNR – Domtar paper mill declined taking any leachate from Marathon Cty landfill and two other closed LFs; noted that some bid requests at sites requesting that loads won't be declined if PFAS is found in future (not in WI); compared this with pharmaceuticals in waste water as well; class action lawsuit?; focus on goals of clean water and public and environmental health; need for global conversation At the August meeting, Lynn Morgan provided a template that could be used for documenting policy positions. Purpose: if the group or subgroup would like to see policy change, this is a place to document and create a bank of positions for when related legislation is proposed The goal is not to provide suggested language but to be very specific with the recommendation on the action needed Add date to template so easier to track Once an item is added to the policy bank it is ready to be sent to a legislator's office. It does not have to go back to the group for approval. →The Group determined that unanimous consensus is likely not possible on all issues. The policy document could include comments on the bottom of "dissenting opinions." Approval by 80% of current Group members is required to post to the Policy Bank. (Percentage of existing Group members based on if vacancies occur or any Group members choose not to vote). Group could choose to hold the issue if fewer than 8 are currently appointed.
		 →Check in annually, likely in first quarter of the year, to ensure all members are comfortable with policy as is or revisit if needed (consider this when add a new member as well) →The vote includes those present at the meeting as well as those voting over email.

 Listed recommendations as short-term actionable, banked/hold, or not feasible: (green, yellow, red) <u>Rec 1</u> – WDNR prepare and issue a guidance document for proposing and implementing an alternative final cover (AFC) design. actionable, green; look at examples in other states, set priorities along with the DNR. →Identify Group or subgroup members to initiate discussions on this topic. Doverspike will contact initial members and others if needed, DNR will designate staff for discussions. <u>Rec 2</u> – Work with EPA on modifications: yellow → Group members will put in policy bank after template is developed <u>Rec 3</u> – DNR designate a committee to id and recommend changes to specific portions of the state and federal code (for specific streamlining elements mentioned in document): yellow → contingent upon group efforts for recommendation 1 <u>Rec 4</u> – Modify NR 500 codes to provide the ability to approve AFC designs based on performance results of those constructed under the RDD program: Discussion - RDD program can now be run for 21 years, EPA has done advanced notice of potential rule making related to bioreactors and results of RDD, just in data gathering phase now. No AFC covers for any landfill RDD program yet, only liquids addition. Yellow → wait for more info on federal rule <u>Recs 5 and 6</u> – WDNR allow for a longer delay in final cover system construction and allow alternative closure phasing, sacrificial covering, and reclaiming airspace from settlement prior to final cover construction: green - Rec 6 is highest priority: there is flexibility in current rules, but more needs to be defined with discussion – 2-years for delayed cap is typical, but site specific issues could add years. Need to define the criteria that would be included to delay cover for organic stability reasons. Group wants these considerations more formalized/standardized, but need to discuss if feasible. → goal to have guidance document(s) on what has been approved wh
 Construction & Demolition (C&D) Landfills Subgroup Ken Ness provided his perspective as a member of the subgroup and owner of a C&D landfill He estimated that C&D landfills represent ~2% of available landfill space in WI, looked at waste exempt from fees overall – stated that that amount would fill up the space available at C&D sites every year (Bart – about 33% of tonnage going to MSW sites is exempt or partial exempt from fees) [note – unverified numbers] Small and intermediate C&D sites are the only ones individuals can afford to build and close and conduct long term care liability; economics limit what can be done at these sites – additional taxes/fees would not be preferred Steps – Need for funding additional DNR oversight? License or other fees versus tonnage fees (no scales or other issues with implementing tonnage fees at small C&D sites)? To do → DNR to assess current fees to C&D and assess costs to provide inspection and other services to C&D sites Need discussions on recycling/reducing C&D materials as well
