PUBLIC NOTICE OF INTENT TO REISSUE A WISCONSIN POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (WPDES) PERMIT No.WI-0020788-11-0

Permittee: VILLAGE OF CROSS PLAINS, 2417 Brewery Road, Cross Plains, WI, 53528-0097

Facility Where Discharge Occurs: Cross Plains Wastewater Treatment Facility, 1000 MAIN STREET (USH 14), CROSS PLAINS, WISCONSIN

Receiving Water And Location: Black Earth Creek in the Black Earth Creek Watershed of Lower Wisconsin River Basin in Dane County. Discharge location is approximately 400 feet upstream of the US 14 crossing.

Brief Facility Description: The Village of Cross Plains operates a wastewater treatment facility providing secondary treatment and nutrient removal for a contributing population of approximately 4,400 people. Treated wastewater is continuously discharged to Black Earth Creek. Treatment consists of mechanical influent screening, selector basins to enhance biological phosphorus removal, oxidation ditch activated sludge secondary treatment, final clarification, and seasonal UV disinfection. Permanent phosphorus chemical treatment is in place but used infrequently due to the combination of biological phosphorus removal and Water Quality Trading credits available. Sludge is aerobically digested and goes through a gravity belt thickener prior to hauling to a different WPDES permitted facility. The facility does not usually land apply under their own permit, but hauls to Dane Iowa WWTF.

The Department has tentatively decided that the above-specified WPDES permit should be reissued.

Limitations and conditions which the Department believes adequately protect the receiving water are included in the proposed permit. Land application of waste shall be done in accordance with permit conditions and applicable codes. All land application sites shall be approved prior to their use. To receive a list of approved sites, or to be notified of potential approvals, contact the above-named basin engineer.

Persons wishing to comment on or object to the proposed permit action, or to request a public hearing, may write to the Department of Natural Resources at the above-named permit drafter's address. All comments or suggestions received no later than 30 days after the publication date of this public notice will be considered along with other information on file in making a final decision regarding the permit. Anyone providing comments in response to this public notice will receive a notification of the Department's final decision when the permit is issued. Where designated as a reviewable surface water discharge permit, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is allowed up to 90 days to submit comments or objections regarding this permit determination. If no comments are received on the proposed permit from anyone, including U.S. EPA, the permit will be issued as proposed.

The Department may schedule a public informational hearing if requested by any person and shall schedule a public informational hearing if a petition requesting a hearing is received from 5 or more persons or if response to this notice indicates significant public interest pursuant to s. 283.49, Wis. Stats. Requests for a public informational hearing shall state the following: the name and address of the person(s) requesting the hearing; the interest in the proposed permit of the person(s) requesting the hearing; the reasons for the request; and the issues proposed to be considered at the hearing.

Information on file for this permit action, including the draft permit, fact sheet and permit application, may be inspected and copied at either the above-named permit drafter's office or the above named basin engineer's office, Monday through Friday (except holidays), between 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Please call the permit drafter or basin engineer for directions to their office location, if necessary. Information on this permit action may also be obtained by calling the permit drafter at (608) 740-0085 or by writing to the Department. Reasonable costs (15 cents per page for copies and 7 cents per page for scanning) will be charged for information in the file other than the public notice, permit and fact sheet.
